## **<u>1. LOCAL LAW #3:</u>**

Attorney Strong spoke with the gentleman from the county and they made some revisions which she then passed out to be Board. Because of these clarification changes, she will prepare a motion for the next Board Meeting to refer this back to the Planning Board.

## 2. SNYDER SUBDIVISION:

Attorney Strong reported that the Environmental has been completed regarding this subdivision application. Board is ready to approve. She will prepare the resolution declaring Neg. Dec. and Approval of Subdivision for Monday's Board Meeting.

## 3. ALDEN GARDEN CLUB REQUEST FOR COMMUNITY CENTER:

Councilwoman Riddoch received the annual request for use of the Community Center. The dates have been cleared with Town Clerk's calendar and Mary will prepare a motion for the approval of request for Monday's Board Meeting.

### 4. ACS SOCCER REQUEST FOR ROBERT O. SMITH PARK:

Councilwoman Riddoch received a request for use of Robert O. Smith park. She will prepare a motion regarding approval of this request for Monday's Board Meeting.

## 5. MILLGROVE FIRE DEPT. MEMBERSHIP:

Councilwoman Riddoch received an application for membership in Millgrove Fire Dept. Attorney Strong will have a resolution ready for Monday's Board Meeting.

### 6. DOG CENSUS:

Councilwoman Riddoch initiated a discussion regarding the need for a dog census. Factors discussed included the best way to handle a census: a mailing/return postcard (at a cost of between \$1,000 - \$1,900), or door-to-door personal contact; where and how budget money would be allocated; who would conduct this census, and how much it would cost to pay someone to physically do an enumeration, etc. Concern was noted because the income from dog licensing does not cover the expenses of the dog budget. It was decided to wait and see how the Town of Newstead makes out with their postcard mailing census approach. Dog Control Officer Weglarski was asked to log and complete paperwork regarding his hours and calls received, etc.

## 7. H.O.P RENEWAL FOR MATTHEW JOZWIAK:

Objection to the advertising wording of the sign outside of Mr. Jozwiak's home was noted by Councilman Witt. Attorney Strong will prepare a motion to renew the Home Occupation Permit contingent upon bringing the sign into compliance. CEO Snyder will inform Mr. Jozwiak.

\* Supervisor Milligan noted that Daryl Beyer was present to answer questions regarding his recently submitted Home Occupation Permit application to restore and sell antiques and collectibles. Board Members questioned him regarding where this would take place, how much space in his barn will be used, how he will advertise, parking situation, etc. Councilman Witt voiced objection to running an antique store, but is OK with restoring antiques and selling them. Supervisor Milligan noted that the law with regard to H.O.P. is being re-written. Daryl stated he would rather not wait.
