WHEREAS, the Town of Alden Planning Board has reviewed the Proposed Action and on October 14, 2014, recommended to the Town Board the approval of the Proposed Action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS THAT:

1. The Town Board did determine that the Proposed Action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA.
2. The Town Board did determine that it should be the Lead Agency for all environmental review of the Proposed Action.
3. WHEREAS, the Town of Alden has received Federal Community Development Block Grant Funds to Purchase a Shuttle Bus for use by the Town of Alden in transporting its senior citizens;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Procurement Policy & Procedure Guidelines of the Town of Alden and General Municipal Law, the Town has formally bid out the purchase of said Shuttle Bus;

WHEREAS, sealed bids were authorized by the Alden Town Board on September 15, 2014 and bid solicitations were published in the required two newspapers;

WHEREAS, one (1) sealed bid was received by the Town of Alden and opened by the Town Clerk on October 10, 2014, as follows: Gorman Enterprises at \$65,041.14;

WHEREAS, Gorman Enterprises is the lowest responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, The Town Board after full and careful review and consideration of the request finds that it is in the public interest to authorize the purchase of the Shuttle Bus.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS, THAT:

1. The Town Board approves the purchase of a new Shuttle Bus, as per the published specifications, from Gorman Equipment for a total price of \$65041.14 (\$61,159.00 to be paid from a CDBG Grant and \$3,882.14 to be paid by the Town of Alden) as being consistent with its policies and in the interests of the residents of the Town of Alden;

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES, OFFICIALS AND PERSONNEL

Attorney Strong:

Attorney Strong redrafted Local Law #4 and e-mailed to the Board last week and put copies of the same in their boxes tonight.

Highway Supt. Wagner:

The beaver dam they addressed off of Genesee Street has been removed.

The island in Cayuga Creek has been removed. The bank has been reseeded and mulched. Two hundred seedlings have also been planted. The Soil Conservation and the Army Corps. of Engineers have made approval.

The Highway Dept. assisted in the cleanup of the spill on Walden Ave. This is the first time ever the DEC authorized a controlled spill. Supervisor Milligan appreciated all the efforts of the Highway Dept. in cooperating with authorities during the cleanup.

Supv. Ass't Colleen Rogers:

Sunn King has cancelled our recycling contract. We are not accepting anything for electronic recycling at the Town Hall any longer. Televisions with the CRT screens can be taken to Best Buy at the Eastern Hills location for recycling at no charge. She talked to Erie County today and they will be going out to bid for a new contract and we should know something next week. She has received at least 30 calls regarding the disposal of televisions. She is calling them back and informing them of Best Buy's site for drop-off. The Village of Alden is still taking Village people's electronics, with proof of residency. Modern Corp. is picking up leaves. They ask for patience, they will pick up what they are able and will come back at another time for the rest.

Eng. Mike Metzger:

Mike has been working with Highway Supt. Wagner on the CSX turn around on Old Wende. Also, he has provided drawings for R.O. Smith drainage problem. National Fuel has installed new gas lines on Cary Rd. a little too close to the road. Hwy. Supt. Wagner expressed his concerns. National Fuel has been contacted with these concerns. Zoeller Rd./Exchange St. water lines: He has received indication today that the DPW will approve the plans as submitted. We will be receiving an official letter shortly. This will be the last approval needed. There is a contractual matter that needs to be discussed with the Board.

Supervisor Milligan:
