

inaccessible to determine if there is asbestos inside, we will have to proceed as if there is. The owner of the building has been in contact with CEO Snyder a couple of weeks ago. Should the Town have to take over the demolition, costs incurred will be put on the owner's taxes. The SEQR process will need to begin, Attorney Strong will have a Lead Agency resolution ready for the 6th.

5. TIPPING CONTRACT

Attorney Strong questioned the Board as to whether they were ready to move forward? All agreed they were. She will prepare a resolution ready for the 6th to solicit for tipping bids. Supervisor Milligan went over a couple of questions he had on the contract. The contract will run 3 years, which will then coincide with the garbage contract at which time they can both be done at one time.

6. DOG LAW

The law was referred to the Planning Board, which will not be able to review until the August meeting. This will be put on hold until they review, then SEQR process can begin.

7. ZOELLER/EXCHANGE WATER DISTRICTS

Supervisor Milligan read a letter he is sending out asking the people to sign a petition in front of a notary. After the petitions are signed, it will take approximately one year to eighteen months for this project to be completed. The letter and petition will be mailed out, but the map plan report will be at the Town Hall for review. Councilman Weber discussed using 12" water lines and the cost projection.

8. TOWN HALL FLOORS

Supervisor Milligan asked CEO Snyder to get a quote from the people that did the floor for maintenance for the year to keep the floors looking good. The cost would be \$95.00 each time they returned. Attorney Strong said it would have to be kept under \$500.00 or two quotes would be needed. A schedule could be set up to have them come in as long as long as it is under \$500.00. Attorney Strong said that a contract should be drawn up with a schedule. The Town already has their proof of insurance on file.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR TODD ALDINGER reported that the easement with the Village was done. Attorney Strong thanked him for his help. He said it was a pretty uncontroversial end of Session. Discussed tax abatement programs. Supervisor Milligan said he is trying to set up a meeting with Lancaster Supervisor Dino Fidoli to discuss expanding their IDA. Supervisor Milligan questioned the status of Walden Avenue. Todd said that the Sheriff and the County Executive couldn't seem to see eye to eye. If they can get into agreement with how they are going to use the Buffalo Correctional Facility, then that would start the process.

ATTORNEY STRONG said that on August 6th we are having the Public Hearing for the Koschuk Home Occupation permit on Sandridge Rd., she will have a resolution ready that night, provided that there is no adverse public comment, it will be approved.

COUNCILWOMAN RIDDOCH heard that the Seniors had talked to the Supervisor about a refrigerator; she said there is \$272.00 donated to the Seniors that she would be happy to put toward a refrigerator. The problem is they want a bigger refrigerator to store more or a second refrigerator to store baked goods. Supervisor Milligan said that they need a freezer to store Erie County meals that will be coming frozen for weekends. DTC Crist said that there is a chest freezer in the Arts and Crafts room at the Community Center. Park Supv. Sojka said that there is and Recreation Supv. Moultrup uses it for freezie pops for Summer Rec. Supervisor Milligan will check this out. Councilwoman Riddoch has spoke with Recreation Supervisor Moultrup about residency requirements. He would like to come to the Board and discuss this with them. She will ask him to come to the next Work Session to discuss this.

PARK SUPERVISOR SOJKA wanted to revisit his request for a water wheel. He received a third quote from John Deere Landscapes for \$7,265.00. There was a discussion about the water wheel. Money is in the budget. Andy is concerned about the fields, they are dormant now, the house soccer league will be starting and this will kill the grass. The fields will need to be revamped in the spring or later this fall. This will be costly. There may be a possibility of canceling the house soccer league for a while until we get some significant rain.
