Supervisor Milligan asked Councilman Weber that if he was not comfortable with this he could think it over until tomorrow. Councilman Weber understands that he needs some help. He has a hundred questions. If he comes in tomorrow what would he be doing? Brush pick-up. Discussion about what if another employee wanted preference over what they were doing to him. Hwy. Supt. Fix said he would advise what he was to do or instruct his foreman to do so. Councilman Weber questioned if Carl was 100% sure that this person is capable of doing any job that needs to be done. He needs him as a back up if he gets a call that someone may be out 3-4 days. Supervisor Milligan told Carl to get an ad together for the paper tomorrow. Attorney Strong will prepare a Resolution setting the rate of pay. Contact Colleen tomorrow regarding the Workmen's Comp. Attorney Strong said you couldn't hire somebody without a Resolution setting the rate of pay.

Hwy. Supt. Fix has vehicles he would like to take to auction, he would like them declared surplus. Discussion about Andy getting the 2006. Supervisor Milligan said if they cannot come to an agreement with the Parks, it should go to auction. The fire truck also needs to go to auction. Attorney Strong will prepare a resolution to declare them surplus for the next Board meeting.

4. DOG LAW

The Planning Board has approved the dog law. We are ready to start the SEQR process and call the public hearing and have the public hearing. Attorney Strong will have the resolution for Lead Agency and the order call the Public Hearing September 17th ready for Tuesday Board meeting. Discussion about changes to the law.

5. TED MORGAN

Ted Morgan accepted the 5% increase to sign his contract.

8. TIPPING CONTRACT

The bid opening is scheduled for this Thursday at 2:00 P.M. at the Town Hall. The bids will be reviewed and could be awarded at this Town Board meeting or the next.

Supervisor Milligan said that there was property on Uebelhoer right at Wende Rd. that was in Water District #3 and then the property was divided. They continued to be charged for the Water District even though they were no longer in the district. They have paid \$1400.00 into the Water District. They now want to know if it is possible to connect to the Water District. Discussion about connection options/reimbursement options. Attorney Strong will research. Engineer Metzger will find out information on the push line option. They will discuss this again.

Update of the Millgrove School – CEO Snyder said that the owner has begun the demolition process. They are having the building checked for asbestos by a licensed contractor. They have signed a contract and the building should be down in a couple of weeks.

CEO Snyder has received two (2) prices on air conditioners.

CBO Glass transfer of the business closed today. The town will be getting \$2700.00 more taxes in 2013. Contract signed.

Supervisor Milligan questioned whether the new election districts would start with the next Primary Day? DTC Crist said that TC Witt called and they would start and some people will be voting in different areas. Post cards will be mailed advising where to vote.

Engineer Michael Metzger contacted Carolyn Dunderdale, NYS Office of General Services regarding the Sievenpiper property. He has not heard back as yet, he will advise when he does.

Councilman Weber spoke with Gil Dussault regarding the roof at the Historical Society. He did not know it needed a roof. They would like to know when the roof had been put on. CEO Snyder will check out to see if there was a record in the Town of when it was put on. Discussion about them becoming a not for profit organization. This would not be an option because they would lose the Town's funding and they need it to run.
