

Work Session of the Clarence Town Board was held on September 9, 2009 at Clarence Town Hall, One Town Place, Clarence, NY.

Supervisor Scott Bylewski called the meeting to order at 6:01 P.M. Members of the Town Board present were Council members Joseph Weiss, Patrick Casilio and Peter DiCostanzo. Other town officials present were Director of Community Development James Callahan, Assistant Planner Brad Packard, Town Attorney Steven Bengart, Town Engineer Joseph Latona, and Senior Building Inspector David Metzger.

James Callahan – Director of Community Development

Transit Valley Animal Hospital - 7591 Transit Road

Applicant is requesting a building permit and architectural approval for an addition to the existing structure. The proposed side is located on the east side of Transit Road, south of Wolcott Road in existing commercial property located in the Restricted Business Zone. Per the Zoning Law, the Town Board has the authority to approve façade changes and recommend on building permits in Commercial Zoning Districts. The applicant has received a variance from the ZBA to allow the side yard setback as designed.

Andy Grimm 8196 County Road

Applicant is proposing to split the property to create an additional residential lot (a total of 2). The existing residential property is located on the north side of County Road, east of Stahley Road within the Swormville TND. Per the Subdivision Law, the Town Board has authority to approve minor splits. The proposed lots would be in conformance with the Traditional Neighborhood District.

Lance Jason/MMJ Enterprises 9737 County Road

Applicant is proposing a small addition and to fill in area for future development. The proposed site is located on the south side of County Road, east of Goodrich Road at existing commercial structure located in the Industrial Business Park Zone. Per the Zoning Law, the Town Board has authority to recommend approval for building permits as to architectural style and functional plan. Also, the town Board has authority to approve fill permits in advance of any future development.

Benchmark-Shops at Main and Transit – 4401 Transit Road

Applicant is proposing to fill previously approved outparcel space with an automotive service use (AAA). The proposed site is situated on the southeast corner of Main Street and Transit Road in existing commercial plaza located in the Major Arterial Zone. Per the Zoning Law, the Town Board has authority to approve automotive uses via a Special Exception Use Permit. A Public Hearing will be required prior to taking final action on the proposed use.

Susan Ballard 9376 Clarence Center Road

Applicant is requesting architectural approval for the construction of a three-unit residence. The proposed site is located on the north side of Clarence Center Road, west of Long Street on existing vacant property located in the Clarence Center TND. Per the Zoning Law, the Town Board has authority to review and approve architectural elevations in the Traditional Neighborhood Zoning District. This land use was originally approved via a Special Exception Use Permit on June 10, 1998. At that time, an architectural elevation approval was based upon a design that incorporated an attached garage with a unit above. Due to engineering and site constraints, the applicant has altered the original design and is now seeking a three-unit residence with a detached 3-car garage in the rear of the site. Applicant will require a Floodplain Permit.

Annual Excavation Permits:

- A. Buffalo Crushed Stone – 20,000+ C.Y. Removal
- B. Emeritus Holdings – 10,000 – 20,000 C.Y. Removal
- C. 10001 Grand Corporation – 10,000 C.Y. Removal

All applications with fees, bonds and DEC permits are on file.

Work Session items for consideration September 23, 2009:

Alan Rosenfeld 9130 Greiner Road

Applicant requests a Demolition Permit for a structure older than 1950.

Verizon Wireless 8095 Tonawanda Creek Road

Applicant is proposing to construct a 99' tall telecommunications tower. The proposed site is located on the south side of Tonawanda Creek Road, east of Transit Road on existing vacant land consisting of 36+/- acres in the Agriculture Flood Zone. Per the Zoning Law and Satellite, Antenna and Tower Law, the Town Board may consider telecommunications tower via a Special Exception Use Permit. A public hearing will be required prior to taking final action on the permit. The Planning Board has forwarded an approval on the site plan as prepared.

Jerry Dewes 10470 County Road

Applicant is proposing to construct an in-law apartment as an addition to existing single-family residential structure. The existing residential property is located on the north side of County Road, east of Strickler Road on 10.5+/- acres in the Agriculture Rural Residential Zone. Per the Zoning Law, the Town Board may approve secondary living units via a Special Exception Use Permit.

Supervisor Scott Bylewski

The budget review process is on-going. If there are any questions or you want to meet with the Supervisor, let him know. Supervisor Bylewski asked the Board to talk to their liaison appointments to see if they have any questions or concerns. Once the budget is submitted to the Town Clerk, Supervisor Bylewski will set budget meeting dates to meet as a Board to discuss the budget.

Representatives from LOSAP will be present at the October 7th Work Session.

Supervisor Bylewski received ISO information from several other fire companies. The only other company that has been impacted is Swormville VFC. The reports are available in the Supervisor's office.

Town Justice Robert Sillars is requesting permission for Court Clerk's Marilyn Taton and Mary Zimmerman to attend the NYS Magistrates and Court Clerks Conference held in Albany on October 4 thru October 7, 2009 with all expenses paid by the Town.

Supervisor Bylewski has two Special Event Requests: Buffalo Tour de Farms Bicycle Ride to be held September 26th and a Block Party request.

Supervisor Bylewski has several items to discuss in Executive Session regarding employment history of several individuals and several Attorney-Client items to discuss as well.

Supervisor Bylewski stated that the Board received a memo from Senior Code Enforcement Office David Metzger regarding the branding effort we are undergoing as a town. Supervisor Bylewski submitted a draft response to the Town Board. It is his intention to reply to that memo unless there are objections by the Town Board as was stated before, it is the Town Board's intent to proceed with using the branding logo on the vehicles as was talked about for the Assessor's, Building, Engineering, Planning and the Supervisor's office. Animal Control and Public Safety vehicles just had decal work done so we will wait for vehicle replacement to convert those vehicles. Supervisor Bylewski still has to talk to Parks Department about a roll out but it is still his intent to have the logo on Parks vehicles. There are some concerns about white vehicles that was talked about. Highway Superintendent Donner would prefer not to use the logo. It was stated at the last meeting that if there were no objections, that was the plan of action that the Board would take. If there are no objections to the memo, Supervisor Bylewski will send it tomorrow indicating that the Town Board desires to move ahead with the branding logo.

Councilman DiCostanzo stated that Senior Building Inspector Dave Metzger made some valid points in his memo and if there is a way to tone down his vehicles so they don't look so colorful, that would be helpful.

Councilman Weiss stated that two weeks ago whether you liked the branding or not, no one spoke against it. He is not a champion of, for or against but the Town Board agreed to it. As much as he appreciated Dave Metzger's input he felt it was after the fact because we have already experienced the set up costs and charges for each

vehicle. Supervisor Bylewski stated that to be fair to Mr. Metzger, some objections were raised at the last meeting in August.

Supervisor Bylewski has heard that some departments would like the logo to be larger, this can be worked out.

Councilman Kolber notified Supervisor Bylewski that he would be late to this meeting.

Councilman Joseph Weiss

Upon recommendation of Town Engineer Latona, Councilman Weiss will make a motion authorizing payment of \$2040.00 for metering at the Tonawanda Creek Rapids as part of our joint funding agreement with the Town of Amherst.

Highway Superintendent Ted Donner is requesting a bid date of September 22, 2009 at 10:00 AM for the replacement of the roof on the main office and shop building at the Highway Department.

Erie County is hosting a drop off at ECC South Campus on September 26, 2009 from 9AM – 1PM for electronic equipment (computers, monitors, keyboards, modems, printers, cell phones, TV's etc.).

When Clarence Center VFC requested approval to construct a training facility at their site Councilman Weiss asked if it was just for Clarence Center VFC or could any fire department use the facility. He was assured that any fire department within the town would be permitted to use it for training. Swormville VFC is now requesting \$150,000 funding for an OSHA approved training facility. Supervisor Bylewski stated that Swormville is under a three year contract however, we should find out what type of facility they are proposing.

Councilman Weiss has one Attorney-Client item to discuss.

Councilman Patrick Casilio

A Public Hearing is scheduled for September 23 regarding the Grass Law. Several residents in the Hollow have already started cleaning up and making improvements to their properties.

Councilman Casilio would like the Town Board's consensus on the AM Radio Station. Supervisor Bylewski suggested Councilman Casilio double check with our Disaster Coordinators, it is his understanding from the last conversation he had with them on this issue that they did not want to pursue it any further and they would not use it. If you are looking to provide a tool even though it is grant funded that will not be used, there is no reason to go forward with it.

Councilman Casilio has one Attorney – Client item to discuss.

Councilman Peter DiCostanzo

The Planning Board referred the Master Plan Amendment regarding a 300' buffer to the TEQR Committee. Councilman Weiss stated that he would like to request TEQR look at the full build-out of a Wegman's.

Councilman DiCostanzo has one item to discuss in Executive Session regarding the employment history of an individual.

Councilman Kolber arrived at 6:35 PM.

Councilman DiCostanzo will set a public hearing for October 14, 2009 to consider Historic Preservation Status for the Historical Museum 10465 Main Street.

Councilman DiCostanzo will appoint Gary Server to the Youth Board and Norman Kirchner to the Senior Center Board to fill Robert Friedman's term which expires 12/31/2011.

Councilman DiCostanzo rode his bike past the Burgher and Grains Automotive Sales and Service at 10939 Main Street. He questioned whether the Board came up with a number of vehicles allowed for the service portion of the dealership. There are cars

parked everywhere. Director of Community Development James Callahan will follow-up on the applicants permit.

Councilman DiCostanzo inquired as to the outcome of the meeting with representatives from various fire companies. Supervisor Bylewski stated that they discussed fiscal constraint and several individual budget items. There was also discussion regarding ISO. No minutes are taken at these meetings; it is not an official meeting. The Supervisor along with the Fire Company liaison meet to discuss and understand their budget items.

Councilman DiCostanzo was approached by an individual that felt the motion the Town Board made at the August 26th Town Board meeting allowing advertising signs to remain up year around at the Soccer Center was one of the worst decisions the Town Board has ever made. Supervisor Bylewski has had discussions with the Soccer Club and the practical solution is what has been done with other organizations.

Councilman Bernard Kolber

Councilman Kolber will appoint Patricia Burkard to the ZBA.

Councilman Kolber has read through the Sign Law and there are several items he would like to discuss with either the Town Board or the Planning Board as to the different aspects of the law. Councilman Casilio stated he would also like to meet with the Planning Board, the law is very close to being good, and he would like to get some answers.

Supervisor Bylewski stated that there is a public hearing scheduled for the September 23rd Town Board meeting regarding the Sign Law. A special meeting would have to be set to meet to further discuss the Sign Law. Councilman Weiss suggested Councilman Kolber meet with Planning Board Chairman Gerald Drinkard to address his concerns. Councilman Kolber suggested the Planning Board look at other towns to see what is in their laws. Supervisor Bylewski stated that some of our laws have had to be reviewed from time to time and changes had to be made. If there is something that comes up that is not the intent of the law but the strict interpretation is that it can not be done then we can deal with it at that time. If there is an extreme hardship, the applicant can be referred to the ZBA.

Councilman Kolber will review the sign law line by line, insert his comments/suggestions and e-mail it to everyone to review.

Sr. Building Inspector David Metzger presented a new version of his monthly building report. Twenty-six building permits (excluding mobile home permits) have been issued to date. The Building Department has seen an increase in remodeling and addition permit, people are reinvesting in their property.

Councilman Kolber stated that he has heard different people say that they would like to build however; the price of land has made it impossible.

Councilman Kolber has one Attorney-Client item to discuss.

Town Attorney Steven Bengart

Town Attorney Bengart has one Attorney – Client item to discuss and two Executive Session items regarding pending litigation.

Motion by Supervisor Bylewski, seconded by Councilman Weiss to enter into Executive Session pursuant to § 105 (1) D pending litigation: Marinaccio vs. Town of Clarence and LOSAP; § 105(1) F the employment history of particular individuals. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the Work Session adjourned at 6:55 PM.

Regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Clarence was held Wednesday, September 9, 2009 at the Clarence Town Hall, One Town Place, Clarence, New York.

Supervisor Scott Bylewski called the meeting to order at 7:40 P.M. Pledge to the flag was led by Councilman Joseph Weiss, followed by a moment of silence in honor and memory of our fallen servicemen.

Members of the Town Board present were Council Members Peter DiCostanzo, Patrick Casilio, Bernard Kolber, Joseph Weiss and Supervisor Bylewski. Other Town officials present were Director of Community Development James Callahan, Town Attorney Steven Bengart, Town Engineer Joseph Latona, Planner Brad Packard and Building Inspector David Metzger.

Supervisor Bylewski said the Town Clerk's office is working on the minutes of the previous meetings held August 26, 2009 and September 2, 2009, however they are not ready at this time.

Supervisor Bylewski announced that in memory of September 11, 2001, Joe Mohan will perform a repertoire of classical and patriotic music on the piano on September 11, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. at the Clarence United Methodist Church, 10205 Greiner Road. Admission is free.

Supervisor Bylewski said that Erie County Department of Environment and Planning has asked us to announce at the meetings for the next few months that they designated November 1 through November 30 as the annual thirty-day time period within which a landowner may request predominantly viable agricultural land for inclusion to a certified agricultural district. Applications are available in the offices of Town Clerk, Assessor and Supervisor. You can also contact John Opalka, Erie County at 858-6229 for more information.

Motion by Supervisor Bylewski, seconded by Councilman Kolber to grant permission for Court Clerks Marilyn Taton and Mary Zimmerman to attend the NYS Magistrates and Court Clerks Conference to be held in Albany October 4 – 7, 2009 with all reasonable and necessary expenses paid by the Town. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Supervisor Bylewski, seconded by Councilman Kolber to approve the request for a Block Party that was held September 2, 2009 on Hilton Drive from 2:00 to 8:00 p.m. On the question, Supervisor Bylewski said all appropriate agencies were notified. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Supervisor Bylewski, seconded by Councilman Kolber to approve a Special Event Request for Buffalo Tour de Farms Bicycle Ride on September 26, 2009 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. along certain roads and the bike path. On the question, Supervisor Bylewski said all appropriate agencies will be notified. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Councilman Weiss, seconded by Councilman Kolber to authorize payment of \$2,040 for metering at Tonawanda Creek Rapids as part of our joint funding agreement with the Town of Amherst. On the question, Councilman Weiss said this gives us an indication of the rising waters of the creek before it gets to certain areas. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Councilman Weiss, seconded by Councilman Kolber to set a Bid Date of September 22, 2009 at 10:00 a.m. for replacement of the roof on the main office and shop buildings at the Highway Department. Bid Specifications will be available at the Highway Department and at the Town Clerk's Office. On the question, Town Clerk Nancy Metzger noted that we previously held a bid opening for this project, but no bids were received. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Councilman Weiss announced that Erie County is hosting a Hazardous Waste Drop Off at Honeywell, 20 Peabody Street, Buffalo on September 12, 2009 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for pesticides, fertilizers, oil-based paints, batteries, etc.

Erie County is also hosting a Drop Off at ECC South Campus on September 26, 2009 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for computers, monitors, keyboards, modems printers, cell phones, TV's, etc.

Councilman Weiss said he made a motion to send the Wegmans project to TEQR. He added, for the record, that sending it to TEQR we add the Wegmans project information for their review.

Motion by Councilman Kolber, seconded by Councilman Casilio to appoint Patricia Burkard as Alternate Member to the Zoning Board of Appeals with term to expire 12/31/09. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Councilman Kolber said we received notice from Time Warner that they have sent out the check for the franchise fees in the amount of \$106,240.42.

Councilman Kolber said the clock dedication was held over the weekend at the four corners. Tim Pazda and the Clarence Community Association did a great job with that.

Councilman Casilio also thanked the Clarence Community Association, especially Tim Pazda, who helped raise a lot of money to purchase the clock. It has a huge impact on the four corners. It was a great project. The Bank of Akron has also been very helpful.

Motion by Councilman DiCostanzo, seconded by Councilman Weiss to set a Public Hearing for October 14, 2009 at 7:50 P.M. to consider Historic Preservation Status for the Clarence Historical Museum at 10465 Main Street. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Councilman DiCostanzo, seconded by Councilman Casilio to appoint Gary Server to the Clarence Youth Board to fill the term of Susan Smerda, with term to expire 12/31/2011. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Councilman DiCostanzo, seconded by Councilman Kolber to appoint Norman Kirchner to the Clarence Senior Center Board to fill the term of Robert Friedman, with term to expire 12/31/2011. Upon roll call – Ayes: Councilmembers DiCostanzo, Casilio, Kolber and Supervisor Bylewski; Noes: Councilman Weiss. Motion carried.

Councilman DiCostanzo reported that there were nine single family building permits issued in August, all being outside of subdivisions. That brings us to a total of 31 through August 2009.

Councilman DiCostanzo thanked the Clarence Center Fire Company for another great Labor Day Fair. He and his family enjoyed all of the festivities.

Supervisor Bylewski thanked all department heads in attendance for coming tonight.

Supervisor Bylewski recognized Bob Geiger from the Chamber of Commerce. Councilman DiCostanzo recognized Debbie Wixson also from the Chamber and Bee Newspapers.

Transit Valley Animal Hospital requests recommendation on a Building Permit and Architectural Approval for an addition to the existing facility at 7591 Transit Road. James Callahan said the property is located on the east side of Transit Road, south of Wolcott Road consisting of an existing commercial operation in the Restricted Business Zone.

Teresa Musso from Kelkenberg Construction was present. The additional space is to be used for a surgery area. It will consist of 1,730 sq. ft. all in the back of the building.

Motion by Supervisor Bylewski, seconded by Councilman Casilio to grant a Building Permit and Architectural Approval for an addition to the existing facility at 7591 Transit Road, subject to all appropriate fees including commercial open space fee. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Andy Grimm requests Minor Subdivision Approval to create one additional Residential Building Lot at 8196 County Road. James Callahan said the location is on the north side of County Road, east of Stahley Road consisting of vacant land in the Traditional Neighborhood District.

Kathy Grimm was present.

James Callahan said the lot sizes would be more than adequate.

Motion by Councilman DiCostanzo, seconded by Councilman Kolber that pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and upon the recommendations of the Planning and Zoning Department, the Clarence Town Board issues a Negative Declaration on the proposed Grimm Minor Subdivision. This Unlisted Action involves the development of one new residential building lot located at 8196 County Road. After thorough Review of the submitted survey and the Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) by the Planning and Zoning Department and Town Board, it is determined that the proposed action is consistent with Master Plan 2015 and local land use regulations and will not have a significant impact upon the environment. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Councilman Kolber, seconded by Councilman Casilio to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Clarence Town Board grants the request of the applicant, Andy Grimm, for Minor Subdivision Approval to create one additional residential building lot located on the north side of County Road, east of Stahley Road, at 8196 County Road subject to the following condition: 1. Open Space and Recreation Fees.

Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Lance Jason/MMJ Enterprises requests recommendation for a Building Permit and a Fill Permit at 9737 County Road. James Callahan said the location is the south side of County Road, east side of Goodrich Road consisting of an existing commercial operation in the Industrial Business Park Zone.

Lance Jason said the area in the front is green space. He does not have a tree survey.

Supervisor Bylewski said the Board is hesitant to issue a fill permit without a plan.

Mr. Jason said he has no future plan, but he would like to clean up the property.

Motion by Supervisor Bylewski, seconded by Councilman Casilio to grant a Building Permit, subject to appropriate fees including open space fee; and a Fill Permit, subject to Landscape Committee Approval at 9737 County Road. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Benchmark/Shops At Main and Transit requests a Special Exception Use Permit for an automotive service center. James Callahan said the location is at Main and Transit.

The representative from Benchmark was present. They have a tenant, AAA, who would like to occupy the entire building to include the travel agency, insurance agency and automotive diagnostic and service work. The building will match the other buildings in the complex. It consists of 10,200 sq. ft. There will be a total of 12 bays with six on the front and six on the back.

Motion by Supervisor Bylewski, seconded by Councilman Casilio to set a Public Hearing for October 14, 2009 at 7:45 P.M. to consider the request for a Special Exception Use Permit for an automotive service center at the Shops At Main and Transit. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Motion carried.

Susan Ballard requests Architectural Approval for a previously approved three-family residential structure at 9376 Clarence Center Road. James Callahan said the location is the north side of Clarence Center Road, west of Long Street in the Traditional Neighborhood District. The applicant previously received a Special Exception Use Permit for a three-family unit.

Supervisor Bylewski said the applicant was present at the meeting held August 26, 2009 at which a public hearing was set for an amendment to the Special Exception Use Permit. The Town Board since that time received an opinion from the Town Attorney that it was not necessary based on review of the record. All comments made at the previous meeting are incorporated here by reference.

Susan Ballard, owner of the property was present. She has had a conversation with the engineering department since the last meeting regarding the drainage issues.

Motion by Councilman Kolber, seconded by Councilman Casilio to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Clarence Town Board grants and approves the request of the applicant, Susan Ballard, for Architectural Approval for the construction of a three-unit residence at 9376 Clarence Center Road, subject to the following condition: 1. Open Space and Recreation Fees.
