

A Work Session of the Town Board of the Town of Clarence was held on Wednesday, June 24, 2015 at Clarence Town Hall, One Town Place, Clarence, New York.

Supervisor David Hartzell called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. Members of the Town Board present were Councilmember's Bernard Kolber, Patrick Casilio, and Robert Geiger. Councilman DiCostanzo was absent. Other Town Officials present were Town Attorney Lawrence Meckler, Town Engineer Tim Lavocat, Senior Building Inspector David Metzger, Planning Board Chairman Robert Sackett, Confidential Secretary to the Supervisor Karen Jurek, Highway Superintendent James Dussing, and Director of Administration and Finance Pam Cuvillo.

Highway Superintendent James Dussing

Clarence resident Hans Mobius requested the speed limit on County Road between Salt and Heise Road be reduced to 45MPH. Erie County DPW has conducted a speed study which concluded that a speed reduction was not absolutely necessary. In speaking with Erie County Traffic Engineer Michael Asklar, he agreed that due to the accident history on the stretch of County Road (even though most of the accidents were from vehicles not stopping at the stop sign) the County is suggesting a 50MPH speed limit. County Road is a major thoroughfare which carries a lot of commercial traffic. Coming from Newstead which is 45MPH, the speed limit would increase to 50MPH from Salt to Heise. Then would drop to 40MPH from Heise to Transit Road. If the Town Board was in agreement with this, a resolution will be drafted and presented at the next Town Board meeting to move forward with obtaining a permit from the County. The Town Board was in agreement with this.

Superintendent Dussing and Town Engineer Lavocat have met with Greenman-Pederson, Inc. relative to flood reduction in the north end of town, they are providing very good information and data regarding cleaning and dredging Black Creek to Transit Road. More field work will be conducted within the next two weeks and then all information and data will be compiled.

The next two paving projects will be on Cameron Drive and Kraus Road. Kraus Road will be widened.

Director of Administration and Finance – Pamela CuvIELLO

Per the memo from Paralegal Cindi Rosel, effective July 1, 2015 the Town of Clarence is joining the Labor-Management Healthcare Fund for purchasing health insurance. Employees will continue to be covered by the Blue Cross-Blue Shield Plus plan with no change in benefits. There will be a change in the way in which the prescription drug benefit is administered.

Pam stated that she received an e-mail from Labor Counsel Heather Giambra explaining what the new procedures going to be and how LMHF is going to be paid and it has to be funded. Pam is looking for authorization from the Town Board to fund the account which has been set up through Labor-Management Healthcare Fund (LMHF). When Pam and Heather Giambra met with LMHF, they recommended a month and a half worth of bills to the limit of what is in our contract which is approximately \$150,000 and then there is a separate one for prescription drugs which is approximately \$45,000 that they would like funded so they can pay the bills as they come in. When Pam cuts checks every two weeks, she can just send them a check rather than do a wire every week to cover those bills which can get costly. Town Attorney Meckler stated that by approving and signing the original agreement, the Board has already authorized LMHF. The Town Board does not need to make a motion, they can just direct Pam to act in accordance with Heather Giambra memo with respect to setting up funds, and no formal resolution is needed. By signing the contract, the Town has to adhere to all their rules and regulations. Pam further stated that this is a different way of doing it, before she paid the bills monthly as the bills come in now, they will be paid on a weekly basis which is why she has to have it funded.

If Pam deposits the money that LMHF is recommending, then she would be okay to pay them on a bi-weekly basis for whatever invoices they mail her every Monday.

Councilman Casilio stated that he wanted to make sure that the Town does not overpay Alliance. Pam stated that they are done.

New insurance cards have been mailed out, a separate card will be mailed for prescriptions. Both cards will have to be taken to your pharmacy.

Representatives from the Labor-Management Healthcare Fund will be available on Monday, June 29th in the Town Hall Auditorium to answer any questions.

Deputy Recreation Director PT - Christopher Durr

Recreation Director Clifford Trapper has received an e-mail request from a Newstead resident requesting the town allow her child to enroll in the Town of Clarence Swim Program for the summer because the Town of Newstead's indoor pool is closed for repairs. There are several neighboring towns that their children go to Clarence Schools but they physically live in the Town of Newstead, Lancaster or Amherst. Karen Jurek stated that if this gets opened up to non-residents, you will have to figure if those signing up are actually Clarence School District students. Chris Durr stated that they would work in conjunction with the school district. There was a lengthy discussion as to how to go about charging non-residents and what the additional cost to the town would be if any. In further discussion, it was noted that Newstead does not have a town pool, they host their swim lessons at the indoor high school pool which will be under construction for the 2015 summer season. It was also noted that the request came in from a Newstead resident and not from the Supervisor of the Town of Newstead or from the Recreation Supervisor.

Town Attorney Meckler stated that if the Town of Clarence was going to give a blanket approval to the Town of Newstead for use of our pool for the summer, we would require a Certificate of Insurance from Newstead, listing the Town of Clarence as additional insured. Town Attorney Meckler stated that we should receive a formal request from the Town of Newstead Supervisor with the number of children that would be attending.

Supervisor Hartzell stated that before the entire program is changed for one person, he will contact the Newstead Town Supervisor to see what his thoughts are.

Chris Durr asked the Board for their thoughts on allowing non-residents who go to Clarence Schools and want to participate in the Swim Lesson Program. Deputy Town Clerk Darcy Snyder stated that the Town Clerk's office receives requests all the time from non-residents in our bordering towns (Amherst, Lancaster, Newstead) whose children go to Clarence Schools requesting use of the town pool and the town park facilities. Once it is explained to them that their school taxes do not pay for the parks they are understanding of that condition.

Councilman Kolber asked how you would know who these kids are unless they came in with a tax bill. Chris Durr said if we wanted them to be allowed to use the pool, we could charge them double and work with the school to verify enrollment in the Clarence Schools. Councilman Kolber stated that he is not against allowing non-residents who attend Clarence Schools use of the pool if there is available capacity however, he does not want it to become a burden or getting out of hand.

Chris Durr also requested an upgrade in the pool structure, it is the original structure. He is constantly getting complaints that the shower facilities are not big enough. He felt it was time to start to look at improvements to the locker room/guard room area to bring it up to the date with the improvements to match the rest of the pool.

There will be no July 1st. morning Work Session.

The Erie County Sheriff's is requesting the medicinal drop box be moved to the Town Hall rather than the Sheriff substation on Goodrich Road. The elderly are having trouble walking up the stairs at the substation. Highway Superintendent Dussing stated that it gets very busy, his office assists the Sheriff's if they are between shifts.

Supervisor Hartzell received a request from a Clarence school teacher asking that the Town waive the fees for use of the town pavilions for their class picnics, she indicated that the pavilions are only used twice a year. Deputy Town Clerk Darcy Snyder stated that several schools (Ledgeview, Harris Hill, Sheridan Hill, Clarence High School) use the town pavilions for their functions and it is not just twice a year. Many groups within the High School use the pavilions as well (Latin Club, Swim Club, Treble Chorus, Chorale, Indoor Track, Freshmen Orientation, National Art Honor Society) etc. The Town Board stated that they did not want to set a precedence, if you are using the pavilions everyone should pay.

Motion by Supervisor Hartzell, seconded by Councilman Kolber to enter into Executive Session pursuant to § 105 (1) D of the Open Meetings Law to discuss proposed/current litigation; § 105(1) E Collective negotiations pursuant to Article 14 of the Civil Service Law (The Taylor Law) § 105(1) F the employment history of a particular person. Upon roll call – Ayes: Councilman Geiger, Councilman Casilio, Councilman Kolber, and Supervisor Hartzell: Noes: None. Absent: Councilman DiCostanzo. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the Work Session adjourned at 6:58PM.

Regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Clarence was held on Wednesday, June 24, 2015 at the Clarence Town Hall, One Town Place, Clarence, New York.

Supervisor David Hartzell called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Councilman Patrick Casilio led in the pledge to the flag, followed by a moment of silence.

Members of the Town Board present were Councilmembers Robert Geiger, Patrick Casilio, Bernard Kolber and Supervisor Hartzell. Councilman Peter DiCostanzo was absent. Other Town officials present were Town Attorney Lawrence Meckler and Town Engineer Timothy Lavocat.

Motion by Supervisor Hartzell, seconded by Councilman Kolber to accept the minutes of the work session and regular meeting held June 10, 2015. Upon roll call – Ayes: All; Noes: None. Absent: Councilman Peter DiCostanzo. Motion carried.

Motion by Supervisor Hartzell, seconded by Councilman Casilio that upon the recommendation of Highway Superintendent, James Dussing, the bid be awarded to Baschmann Services Incorporated of 1101 Maple Road, Elma, NY for a 2015 Brush & Stump Shredding and Mulching attachment for the Highway Excavator at their bid of \$24,159.

On the question, Supervisor Hartzell said Baschmann Services Incorporated was the lowest responsible bidder for this equipment.

Motion by Councilman Kolber, seconded by Councilman Casilio to authorize the Supervisor to sign an Agreement for floor mats, apparel and related items with CINTAS for the Building Department, Dog Control Department, Engineering Department, Highway Department, Parks Department and for the Town Hall subject to review and approval of the Town Attorney.

He was a longtime resident and member of the Clarence Center Fire Company. Also, in memory of Lucy Aiken, who everyone knew from her restaurant that she operated in Clarence Center for many years.

Supervisor Hartzell adjourned the meeting at 7:55 p.m.
