Description:

The Rural Domestic Preparedness Consortium (RDPC) will be offering this course. This awareness-level course is designed to provide rural communities with basic knowledge should a mass fatality incident impact their jurisdiction. This course serves as a training tool to provide rural communities with information to manage an actual mass-fatality response and assist in the development of a mass-fatality response plan for their jurisdiction. The process of recovery, identification, and disposition of human remains following a mass fatality event will differ from the “normal” daily operations to which local authorities are accustomed. Understanding and appreciating these differences and the dynamics of a mass fatality will enable the rural communities to respond in an efficient manner and provide the assistance and guidance needed by the affected community.
