**DESCRIPTION:** 

RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS: CANDIDATES MUST HAVE BEEN LEGAL RESIDENTS OF ERIE COUNTY FOR AT LEAST ONE MONTH IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE OF THE WRITTEN TEST AND MUST BE LEGAL RESIDENTS OF ERIE COUNTY AT THE TIME OF APPOINTMENT. At present there is one vacancy in the Erie County Department of Social Services-Youth Services Division.

A promotion examination will be held at the same time as this examination. The list resulting from the promotion examination will be used first but appointments from this open competitive examination are anticipated. Use of the list may be suspended after it is one year old for any position which it is practical to fill through a new promotion examination.

#### **EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:**

A Detention Home Intake Worker completes of the intake process for children referred or directed into an Erie County Detention Program;

Supervises the process and completes the intake of juveniles referred or directed into an Erie County Detention program;

Completing an assessment packet and interview including reasons for referral, historical and biographical data, to include health, mental health and suicide screenings, service needs assessments, and determines possible alternatives to long-term Detention care;

Supervises all staff assigned on his/her shift and coordinates all operations at the center;

Maintains or supervises the records at the Detention Center, admissions/discharges, daily child records, critical incident review procedures, operations, maintenance, which are reviewed and utilized by the administrative and professional social work staff;

Ensures that the welfare of the residents is maintained by having sufficient staff on each shift, calls in replacement staff as needed, maintains ordered levels of supervision;

Arranges for the emergency transportation of children for medical or psychiatric care from Detention to hospitals or other facilities;

Coordinates the admissions, discharges and emergency requirements of contract Detention programs.

<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Candidates must meet the following requirements on or before the date of the written test:

- A. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Master's Degree in Social Work, Human Services, Psychology, Counseling, Education, Criminal Justice or a closely related field and one year of post degree experience working with defiant, aggressive or emotionally disturbed children in an agency adhering to acceptable standards; or:
- B. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered four year college or university with a Bachelor's Degree in Social Work, Human Services, Psychology, Counseling, Education, Criminal Justice or a closely related field and \*two years of post degree experience\* working with

defiant, aggressive or emotionally disturbed children in an agency adhering to acceptable standards, or.

- C. An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (A) and (B). SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: Candidates must:
  - 1. Possess a valid New York State Driver's License
  - 2. Clear the New York State Child Abuse Registry

NOTES: 1. \* Up to one year as a student intern working specifically with this population may be substituted for one year under (B). 2. Verifiable part-time and/or volunteer experience will be pro-rated toward meeting full-time experience requirements. 3. Your degree and/or college credit must have been awarded by a regionally accredited college or university or one recognized by the New York State Education Department as following acceptable educational practices. A grade of "D" or better is necessary for a course to be credited as successfully completed. If your degree and/or college credit was awarded by an educational institution outside of the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. You can write to this Department for a list of acceptable companies providing this service; you must pay the required evaluation fee.

Notice to Candidates: Transcripts will now be accepted by the Department of Personnel ONLY at time of application.

All subsequent transcripts must be submitted at time of interview.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION:

The New York State Department of Civil Service has not prepared a test guide for this examination. However, candidates may find information in the publication "How to take a written test" helpful in preparing for this test. <u>SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION</u>: The written test is designed to test for knowledge, skills, and/or abilities in such areas as:

- CHILD AND ADOLESCENT DEVELOPMENT: These questions test for knowledge of the
  principles, practices, and problems related to child and adolescent growth and development.
  Questions may cover such topics as concepts and principles of development; normal and
  abnormal patterns of behavior; dynamics of relationship formation; causes of problem
  behaviors; and the effects of peers, family, personality, and sociological influences on
  development and behavior.
- 2. <u>PREPARING WRITTEN MATERIAL</u>: These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.
- 3. <u>SITUATIONS AND PROBLEMS IN SUPERVISING AND COUNSELING DELINQUENT AND/OR SOCIALLY MALADJUSTED YOUTH</u>: These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices of supervising and counseling delinquent and socially maladjusted youth. Questions may cover such topics as interviewing, counseling, supervising, and guiding youth with social adjustment problems; crisis intervention; handling emergencies; and working with staff, agencies, and families in supervising and guiding socially maladjusted youth.
- 4. <u>SUPERVISION</u>: These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices employed in planning, organizing, and controlling the activities of a work unit toward predetermined objectives. The concepts covered, usually in a situational question format, include such topics

motivating and developing subordinates; implementing procedural change; increasing efficiency; and dealing with problems of absenteeism, morale, and discipline.

5. WORKING WITH YOUTH: These questions test for the knowledge and abilities needed to work with youth and their problems. Questions may cover such topics as normal and abnormal adolescent behavior and development, youth perspectives and points of view, environmental factors and effects, establishing rapport with youth, problems of alcohol and drug use/abuse, teenage pregnancy, and delinquency.

NOTICE TO CANDIDATES: Unless otherwise noted, candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand held, solar or battery powered calculators. Devices with typewriter keyboards, "Spell Checkers", "Personal Digital Assistants", "Address Books", "Language Translators", "Dictionaries", or any similar devices are prohibited. You may not bring books or other reference materials.

INFORMATION FOR CANDIDATES

APPLICATION FORMS: You may obtain these forms in person at the Erie County Personnel Department, Rath County Office Building, 95 Franklin St., Buffalo. Forms are also available in the libraries and at Town, Village and School District administrative offices.

Mail your application form when completed to the Erie County Department of Personnel, 95 Franklin St., Buffalo, NY 14202.

Candidates who submit incomplete applications and documentation may be disqualified. The Erie County Department of Personnel reserves the right to reject for lateness or to accept applications filed after the advertised filing period.

MILITARY STATUS: Active duty military personnel may file an application for this exam. A special military make-up examination will be conducted for any member of the armed forces of the United States who has duly filed a timely application but who was deprived of the opportunity to compete in the scheduled exam due to active military duty. Special conditions apply to these requests and may be reviewed at the Erie County Department of Personnel.

VETERANS: Disabled and non-disabled veterans as defined in Section 85, New York State Civil Service Law, will have 10 and 5 points, respectively added to their earned scores if successful in the examination. You must claim these credits when you file application but you have an option to waive them any time prior to appointment. If you have already used these credits for a permanent position in NYS, you may not claim them again.

In conformance with section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, CHILDREN OF FIREFIGHTERS AND POLICE OFFICERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.

<u>SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS</u>: Applicants whose religious beliefs prevent their taking examinations before sundown on Saturday and physically handicapped candidates who require special examination facilities should so inform the Erie County Department of Personnel, by a separately mailed letter at the earliest possible date before the test.

MULTIPLE EXAMINATIONS SCHEDULED FOR THE SAME DAY: If you have applied to take a written test announced by either one or several local jurisdictions (county, town, city) scheduled to be held on the same test date as this written test, you must notify each of the local jurisdictions no later than two weeks before the test date, so they can make arrangements for taking all tests at one test site. \*\*For this exam, please complete and submit an Eric County EXAMS CROSS-FILER Form with your Eric County exam application to alert Eric County Civil Service about your additional exams being held at other locations on the same day.\*\* The Cross-Filer Form is found online at: www2.eric.gov/employment/index.php?q=applications or call (716) 858-8484. All examinations for positions in State government will be held at a State examination center. You will be advised by letter when and where to report for your examinations.

ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION: Notice to appear for the test will be conditional as review of application for minimum requirements may not be made until after the written test. Call or write this Department if you have not received your notice 3 days before the date of the test. You may not be admitted to the examination room without official notice.

RATINGS REQUIRED: Tests are rated on a scale of 100 with a passing mark at 70. Unless the announcement states otherwise, you must pass the written test and the oral test, if any. Test instructions may further divide the tests into parts and set minimum standards for each part.

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: If a subject of the examination, training and experience may not be rated if all passing candidates are expected to be immediately reachable for appointment. If rated, training and experience will be based on the statements in your application subject to verification. If this examination includes a qualifying written test, candidates admitted to the test will have conditional approval only. Final decision regarding the qualifications of candidates rests with the New York State Department of Civil Service.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION: You may be required to take a medical examination to determine if you are medically and physically capable of performing the duties of the position.

ELIGIBLE LIST: The eligible list resulting from an examination may also be used for appointment to the same title or to any other title deemed to be similar and appropriate. Eligible lists are active for a minimum of one year and a maximum of four years from the date established.

Background Investigation: Applicants may be required to undergo a State and national criminal history background investigation, which will include a fingerprint check, to determine suitability for appointment. Failure to meet the standards for the background investigation may result in disqualification. Applicants may be required to pay a fee for the investigation.

NOTE: Fingerprints are sometimes required at the time of appointment. When they are required, the fee involved must be paid by the appointee.
