DESCRIPTION:

THIS EXAMINATION IS OPEN TO ALL QUALIFIED EMPLOYEES OF THE ERIE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND PLANNING. There is one present vacancy.

The eligible list resulting from this examination will not supersede currently existing promotional eligible lists for this title, if any. The duration of all promotional eligible lists is four years from date of establishment unless otherwise indicated.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

An Industrial Wastewater Specialist implements several County Sewer Districts' industrial wastewater treatment programs;

Prepares cases litigation and for enforcement action, and prepares Industrial Consent Agreements;

Develops and prepares industrial discharge permits;

Supervises and participates in the preparation of compliance reports to the environmental Protection Agency and New York State Department of Environmental Conservation;

Reviews plans and specifications for industrial pre-treatment facilities;

Reviews operational reports from industries on their industrial treatment and waste treatment facilities;

Reviews the impact of industrial waste discharges on the County's treatment plants, and the State and Federal solid waste, hazardous waste, SPDES, air pollution, etc. requirements;

Develops industrial waste loading allocations;

Analyses industrial self-monitoring reports;

Provides assistance and guidance to higher ranking staff with respect to the industrial waste programs within Erie County Sewer Districts;

Assists in administration of the Industrial Waste Control Program which includes pretreatment, user charge/industrial cost recovery, site plan review and spill control activities;

Assists in developing and conducting seminars and workshops to inform industry representatives with respect to industrial waste control, field sampling and enforcement or regulations;

Investigates instances of non-compliance with standards and requirements and recommends appropriate enforcement actions;

Participates in user charge formula development and assessment of costs to industries;

Assists in the enforcement of the Erie County Sewer District Rules and Regulations;

Performs related work as required.

QUALIFYING EXPERIENCE FOR TAKING THE TEST: Candidates must be permanently employed in the competitive class and must be serving and have served continuously on a permanent or contingent permanent basis in the competitive class for 24 months immediately preceding the date of the written test in Job Group VII, VIII or IX plus the following:

Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Bachelor's degree in engineering or one of the *physical sciences, supplemented by three years of industrial pretreatment program, industrial laboratory or industrial waste regulatory experience.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Possession of a New York State Motor Vehicle Operators License.

NOTES: 1. *Physical sciences include a wide range of fields of study in inorganic and organic chemistry, qualitative and quantitative analyses, biochemistry, astronomy, meteorology, geology, earth science, and physics. 2. Verifiable part-time and/or volunteer experience will be pro-rated toward meeting full-time experience requirements. 3. Your degree and/or college credit must have been awarded by a regionally accredited college or university or one recognized by the New York State Education Department as following acceptable educational practices. A grade of "D" or better is necessary for a course to be credited as successfully completed. If your degree and/or college credit was awarded by an educational institution outside of the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. You can write to this Department for a list of acceptable companies providing this service; you must pay the required evaluation fee.

Transcripts will now be accepted by the Department of Personnel ONLY at time of application.

All subsequent transcripts must be submitted at time of interview.

<u>NOTICE TO CANDIDATES</u>: It is <u>recommended</u> that candidates use a quiet, hand held, solar or battery powered calculator. Devices with typewriter keyboards, "Spell Checkers", "Personal Digital Assistants", "Address Books", "Language Translators", "Dictionaries", or any similar devices are prohibited. You may not bring books or other reference materials.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION: A written test designed to evaluate knowledge, skills and /or abilities in the following areas:

- Educating &Interacting With The Public: These questions test for knowledge of techniques used to
 interact effectively with individual citizens and/or community groups, to educate or inform them about
 topics of concern, to publicize or clarify agency programs or policies, to negotiate conflicts or resolve
 complaints, and to represent one's agency or program in a manner in keeping with good public relations
 practices. Questions may also cover interacting with others in cooperative efforts of public outreach or
 service.
- 2. <u>Collection, Analysis & Interpretation Of Data</u>: These questions test for knowledge of the methods and techniques used to gather, evaluate, organize, and interpret various types of technical data, and the fundamental concepts and computations involved in basic statistical analysis.
- 3. <u>Identifying Industrial Wastes & Reviewing Results Of Chemical Analyses</u>: These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices involved in the identification, sampling, and chemical analysis of industrial wastes, and may include such areas as the characteristics of various types of industrial wastes; the objectives of industrial waste sampling and analysis; sample collection, handling and

- preservation; interpreting results of industrial waste chemical analysis; and terminology associated with sampling and analyzing industrial wastes.
- 4. <u>Preparing Written Material</u>: These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.

INFORMATION FOR PROMOTION CANDIDATES

Unless otherwise indicated, the eligible list resulting from this examination will have a duration of four years and will not supersede existing promotional lists, if any.

RATINGS REQUIRED: Test is rated on a scale of 100 with a passing mark at 70. Test instructions may further divide the tests into parts and set minimum standards for each part. Points will be added to scores of candidates who achieve a passing mark as follows:

VETERANS: Disabled and non-disabled veterans as defined in Section 85, New York State Civil Service Law, will have 5 and 2.5 points, respectively added to their earned scores if successful in the examination. You must claim these credits when you file application but you have an option to waive them any time prior to appointment. If you have already used these credits for a permanent position in NYS, you may not claim them again.

In conformance with section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, CHILDREN OF

FIREFIGHTERS AND POLICE OFFICERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY

shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.

MULTIPLE EXAMINATIONS SCHEDULED FOR THE SAME DAY: If you have applied to take a written test announced by either one or several local jurisdictions (county, town, city) scheduled to be held on the same test date as this written test, you must notify each of the local jurisdictions no later than two weeks before the test date, so they can make arrangements for taking all tests at one test site. **For this exam, please complete and submit an Erie County EXAMS CROSS-FILER Form with your Erie County exam application to alert Erie County Civil Service about your additional exams being held at other locations on the same day.** The Cross-Filer Form is found online at: www2.erie.gov/employment/index.php?q=applications or call (716) 858-8484. - examinations for positions in State government will be held at a State examination center. You will be advised by letter when and where to report for your examinations.
- MILITARY STATUS: Active duty military personnel may file an application for this exam. A special military make-up examination will be conducted for any member of the armed forces of the United States who has duly filed a timely application but who was deprived of the opportunity to compete in the scheduled exam due to active military duty. Special conditions apply to these requests and may be reviewed at the Erie County Department of Personnel.
- ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION: Notice to appear for the test will be conditional as review of application for minimum requirements may not be made until after the written test. Call or write this Department if you have not received your notice 3 days before the date of the test. You may not be admitted to the examination room without official notice.
- <u>SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS</u>: Applicants whose religious beliefs prevent their taking examinations before sundown on Saturday and physically handicapped candidates who require special examination facilities should so inform the Erie County Department of Personnel, by a separately mailed letter at the earliest possible date before the test.
- TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: If a subject of the examination, training and experience may not be rated if all passing candidates are expected to be immediately reachable for appointment. If rated, training and experience will be based on the statements in your application subject to verification. If this examination includes a qualifying written test, candidates admitted to the test will have conditional approval only. Final decision regarding the qualifications of candidates rests with the New York State Department of Civil Service.
- ELIGIBILITY FOR EXAMINATION: You may take the examination if you meet the following requirements: (a) Meet the qualifications as printed in the announcement; (b) you have been separated from the service and permanently reemployed within one year, (c) your name is on a preferred eligible list.
- NOTICE: Any person, otherwise meeting the requirements for an examination, who is laid off from any agency for which the examination is being held, and whose name is presently on a preferred list is eligible to compete in the examination. When completing their applications such persons should be title and location of their last permanent Civil Service employment.
- APPLICATION FORMS: You may obtain these forms in person at the Erie County Personnel Department, Rath County Office Building, 95 Franklin Street, Buffalo. Forms are also available in the libraries and at Town, Village and School District administrative offices.

IMPORTANT APPLICATION FEE – READ CAREFULLY

A \$20 filing fee is required for this exam. The required fee must accompany your application. Send or bring check or money order made payable to Erie County Personnel Department and write the examination number(s) on your check or money order. Do not send or bring cash, as the County cannot be responsible for cash payment. As no refund will be made, you are urged to compare your qualifications carefully with the requirements for admission and file only for those examinations for which you are clearly qualified.
