How can Erie County help me?

Funding is available through the Erie County Community Development Block Grant program to income-eligible households wishing to connect their houses to new community sewer and water services. If your income is no more than the amounts listed below:

Eligible Work

- Plumbing work necessary to connect the house to the sewer or water main
- Costs associated with abandoning septic systems and dry wells
- Tap-in fees/costs charged to the homeowner by the local utility service district
- Ancillary costs to remedy problems caused by new service connection (e.g. water pressure problems)
- Costs of installation or repairs to traps and vents



Financial Assistance

A maximum amount of \$5,000 is available per structure. The funds are provided as a loan carrying 0% interest with repayment deferred until the house is sold or transferred to a new owner. The homeowner is required to execute a note/mortgage with Erie County securing the loan.
