Health Alert #9 - School Rash Illness - 03/06/2002

Rash illness among schoolchildren has been reported from fourteen states beginning in October, 2001. The rash characteristics have varied, but onset has been acute and the rash described as maculopapular, erythematous and pruritic. The Erie County Health Department is collecting reports of rash illness to try and better define an etiology.

Working Case Definition:

Among school-aged children, acute onset of maculopapular erythematous lesions - possibly in a reticulated pattern - on the face, neck, hands, arms, thighs, or trunk that are of varying duration and cannot be attributed to a defined etiology.
