

IT'S THE LAW!

EPA's Lead Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule (RRP)



Requires that firms performing renovation, repair, and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities and pre-schools built before 1978 have their firm certified by EPA (or an EPA authorized state), use certified renovators who are trained by EPA-approved training providers and follow lead-safe work practices.



In general, any activity that disturbs paint in pre-1978 housing and child-occupied facilities is covered, including:

- Remodeling and repair/maintenance
- Electrical work
- Plumbing
- Painting preparation
- Carpentry
- Window replacement

COURSE DESCRIPTION

RRP is an 8 hour certification course that includes classroom instruction and hands-on demonstration. You will learn about the dangers of lead paint poisoning and the precautions you can take against it including:

- ◆ Lead history
- ◆ Health effects
- ◆ Regulations
- ◆ Safe work practices
- ◆ Paint testing
- ◆ Cleaning verification

The passing of a written examination is necessary to receive certification.
