A LOCAL LAW amending Erie County Local Law No. 1-1959, as amended, constituting the Erie County Charter, by amending Section 902(a) of said Charter; and amending Erie County Local Law No. 1-1960, as amended, constituting the Erie County Administrative Code, by amending the heading of Article 9, Section 9.01(3), 9.02(b), 9.05, 9.05(a) and 9.05(c) in order to change the title of the Division of Environmental Control of the Department of Environment and Planning to the Division of Environmental Compliance, changing the qualifications of the Deputy Commissioner in charge of the Division of Environmental Compliance and expanding the scope of services of said division.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Erie County Local Law No. 1-1959, as amended, constituting the Erie County Charter, is amended as follows:

§ 902 - Powers and Duties of Commissioner. The Commissioner of Environment and Planning shall have the following powers and duties.

a. He shall administer the Planning, Environmental [Quality Control] Compliance, Drainage, Flood Control, Solid Waste Management, Sewerage Planning, Construction and Management Functions vested in the Executive Branch of the County Government, provided, however, that this provision shall not be deemed to restrict the powers or duties of any administrative body



b. The Commissioner of Environment and Planning shall appoint a Deputy Commissioner for Planning, a Deputy Commissioner for Sewerage Management and a Deputy Commissioner for Environmental [Control] Compliance.


D. §9.05 Division of Environmental [Control] Compliance; Deputy Commissioner; Functions.

The Division of Environmental [Control] Compliance shall be headed by a Deputy Commissioner, who shall be a [professional engineer licensed to practice in the state of New York and shall meet the standards established by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation or the New York State Department of Health for a principal engineer] person qualified by professional education, training, and at least six years experience in the field of environmental engineering, environmental management or environmental planning.

The Deputy Commissioner, in addition to other duties assigned by the Commissioner:

- a. shall supervise and direct the Environmental [Control] Compliance staff;
- b. shall investigate and take appropriate action to resolve environmental complaints;
- c. shall assist other units of County government, [to] local municipalities, businesses and citizens to achieve and maintain local, state and federal environmental standards.

Section 3. This local law shall be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the state of New York.
