

COUNTY OF ERIE

LOCAL LAW No. 1 - 1966

A local law in relation to the adoption of a county charter for the county of Erie, state of New York, in relation to the voting powers of members of the Erie county board of supervisors.

Became a law May 4, 1966 with the approval of the county executive, no petition protesting. Passed by the local legislative body of the county of Erie. Filed in the office of the secretary of state May 6, 1966.

*Be it enacted by the board of supervisors of the county of Erie as follows:*

Section 1. Section two hundred one of article II of local law number one—nineteen hundred fifty-nine, is hereby amended as read as follows:

§ 201. The board of supervisors. The supervisors of the several cities and towns in the county of Erie, when lawfully convened, shall constitute the board of supervisors, which shall be the legislative and governing body of the county. Each supervisor shall cast a vote or votes based upon the total number of registered voters in the area represented by such supervisor, giving to each supervisor the power to cast one tenth vote for each one thousand registered voters or a major fraction thereof within the area represented by such supervisor.

The number of registered voters shall be determined from the official list of registered voters published annually by the board of elections of the county of Erie showing the number of registered voters in each city, ward and town, which list is published on or about March first of each year. The voting power of each supervisor shall be adjusted pursuant to such tally of registered voters by the clerk of the board of supervisors on May first of each year and shall take effect as of said date.

The clerk of the board of supervisors shall certify and file with the board of supervisors on or before the first day of May of each year the total registration figures of each town, city and ward, together with the voting power of each supervisor.

§ 2. This local law shall take effect immediately.
