A LOCAL LAW requiring contractors bidding on county construction project to be in compliance with Section 220 of New York State Labor Law.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Legislative finding. The Erie County legislature finds that in order to assure compliance with section two hundred twenty of the New York State Labor Law, a local law is needed to protect the public interest, health and welfare of employees engaging in work relative to Erie County general construction contracts and sub contractors.

Section 2. The Erie county administrative code is hereby amended by adding a new section 19.09 thereto to read as follows:

Section 19.09. Construction contracts. Prior to bidding on a construction contract to be let by the county of Erie, the bidder shall certify in writing to the Erie County legislature that (1) it is a participant in a bona fide apprenticeship training program approved by New York State and, which meets the standards contained in section 220 of the New York State Labor Law, (2) it is a participant in an established pension plan solely paid for by the bidder and/or other employers, for the employees who will perform the work, according to the standards of section 220 of the New York State Labor Law, (3) it is a participant in an established health and welfare plan solely paid for by the bidder and/or

other employers for the employees who will perform the work, according to the standards of section 220 of the New York State Labor law and, (4) it pays prevailing wages according to the standards of section 220 of the New York State Labor Law.

Section 3. Applicability. This local law shall apply to all Erie county construction contracts let to bid subsequent to the effective date hereof.

Section 4. Effective date. This local law shall be effective immediately.
