Librock, Town Clerk of the Town of Aurora, Erie County, New York, do hereby certify that at a regular meeting of the Town Board of the aforesaid town, on the 9th day of November, 1998, at the Town Hall, 5 South Grove Street, East Aurora, New York, the following resolution was unanimously adopted, every member present voting therefore, to wit:

Excerpt of Minutes: Town Board Meeting, November 9, 1998      Action #222

Councilman Suttell made a motion to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature has enacted legislation enabling county legislatures to permanently eliminate the sales tax on clothing and footwear, and;

WHEREAS, Erie County municipalities and school districts share in the revenue generated from sales tax that promotes lowered local property taxes, and;

WHEREAS, the elimination of the sales tax on clothing and footwear would result in further diminution of revenue from sources other than property tax from Erie County municipalities and school districts, and;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Aurora urges members of the Erie County Legislature to reject any proposals to eliminate the sales tax on clothing and footwear.

Councilman Irving seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken, unanimously adopted this 9th day of November, 1998.
