SUMMARY

It is recommended that the Erie County Legislature approve the attached resolution for the 2010 Interoperable Emergency Communication Grant Program allowing the County Executive to accept \$940,095 in federal assistance to continue the implementation of a program to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no fiscal impact on the county operating budget. All costs are fully reimbursed. A contract will be signed and funds will be received from the Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program (IECGP) which will cover the total cost of this grant award to the Department of Emergency Services.

REASONS FOR RECOMENDATION

The Department of Emergency Services will be allowed to manage \$940,095 in U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funds to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

As a result of existing threats to homeland security, the federal government through various state agencies has allocated funds to be utilized to improve the ability of local governments to deal effectively with emergency and disaster situations. There is a need for Erie County to enhance its ability to manage emergency and disaster situations.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without this Legislation the IECGP Fiscal Year 2010 contract will not be signed, the funding will not be received for the Department of Emergency Services and the original purpose of what these funds were intended to be utilized to enhance the ability to respond to emergency and disaster related incidents will not be completed.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The County Executive will sign the contract, the \$940,095.00 in Interoperable Emergency Communication Grant Program grant funds will be received, and the Department of Emergency Services will fulfill its requirements.

WHEREAS, U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has agreed to provide funding in the amount of \$940,095 to continue the implementation of a program which enhances the ability for Erie County to manage emergency, disaster and terrorist situations; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature is required to authorize the County Executive to accept the \$940,095 in Federal resources to provide funding for overtime of current personnel, purchase necessary interoperable equipment and to hire a consultant to provide assistance on interoperable communications that will enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that authorization is hereby provided to the County Executive to enter into contract with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency to receive \$940,095 in grant funding for the Department of Emergency Services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that said funds will be utilized to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations; and be it further
