SUMMARY

Request adoption of resolution to authorize the County Executive to enter into a consultant design agreement with Wendel Duchscherer and further authorization to award and enter into an agreement with the responsible low bidder for the Reconstruction of Burdick Road Bridge Project once bids are taken and the lowest responsible bidder is determined, establish a construction contingency, and execute a change order with project engineers Wendel Duchscherer for construction inspection and services during construction, contingent upon authorization of the 2011 bond sale.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The total cost for the design phase of this project is available in SAP B.11027- 2011 Preservation of Bridges and Culverts Design at a not to exceed fee of \$122,900.00

The total cost for the construction phase of this project is currently estimated at \$500,000.00, and is available in SAP B.00191- 2008 Preservation of Bridges, Culverts and Dams.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Due to the summer Legislative recess during the months of August and September it is necessary that this approval be granted, so that the Contract can be awarded to allow the Contractor to begin construction as soon as possible.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The bridge is in dire need of replacement and has been on the Highway Department's list for many years. The replacement is necessary for the safety of the traveling public.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The construction phase of the Project will not be fully implemented in a timely manner and therefore, not completed. As a result of this, the bridge may have to be closed to traffic as its condition worsens.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

After authorization of the 2011 bond sale, a design agreement will be prepared and executed with Wendel Duchscherer. Design work will begin immediately and bids will be taken as quickly as possible. The lowest responsible bidder will be determined by the Department of Public Works, Contract will be awarded, and the County Executive will execute the Construction Contract, establish a construction contingency, and execute the negotiated change order with project engineers Wendel Duchscherer. Construction will begin as soon as possible depending on the weather and the availability of materials. The Department of Public Works will notify the Legislature, for information only, the bid results and contract awardee.

COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE REVIEW

The proposed legislation has been reviewed by the Comptroller's Office and is related to an authorized capital project for which there are sufficient appropriations for the action proposed.

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the reconstruction of Burdick Road Bridge, it will be necessary for the County to execute the design contract with Wendel Duchscherer, the construction contract with the responsible low bidder, establish a construction contingency and negotiate a change order with Wendel Duchscherer for construction inspection and services during construction; and

RESOLVED, that the County Executive be authorized and is hereby directed to award and execute a Contract for the Reconstruction of Burdick Road Bridge Project Number BR 258-2-11, between the County of Erie and Wendel Duchscherer for design services, the lowest responsible bidder, establish a construction contingency and execute a negotiated change order between the County of Erie and project engineers Wendel Duchscherer in an amount not to exceed \$122,900.00, for design, and \$500,000.00, for construction and inspection services, contingent upon authorization of the 2011 bond sale; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the funds for the Reconstruction of Burdick Road Bridge Project be allocated from SAP B.11027 - 2011 Preservation of Bridges and Culverts Design Project fund, for design, in an amount not to exceed \$122,900.00; and be it further
