SUMMARY

Approve the attached resolution to allow the Department of Senior Services to enter into an agreement with the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA), to process applications for low income seniors who are eligible to participate in the EmPower NY program and reduce their home energy bills.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No additional County match is required. The department will earn additional revenues.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Energy bills of eligible low income seniors will be reduced.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The EmPower NY program delivers energy efficiency and energy use education to low-income New Yorkers and can provide access to electric and heating efficiency measures such as ENERGY STAR, lighting and refrigerators, insulation and air sealing, and In-Home energy education so as to reduce the energy bills of those served.

NYSERDA is offering to pay the Department of Senior Services \$20 for each completed, and income verified, EmPower NY application processed.

Eligible seniors in our community may not obtain the benefits offered by the EmPower NY Program
