SUMMARY

It is requested that the Erie County Legislature approve authorizing and directing the Director of Real Property Services spread Sewer District User Charges or Fees against properties within Erie County Sewer District Nos. 1-6 & 8.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications to the County's General Fund. However, a substantial source of revenue is received from the User Charges by the various Sewer Districts to help reduce the Sewer District tax levies.

REASONS FOR RECOMENDATION

Without approval of the attached resolution, the Sewer Districts would have to increase their respective tax levies. Otherwise they would have to send out separate billings for the User Charges, which would add a significant cost to the operation of the Districts.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Erie County Sewer Districts are funded essentially by the tax levies they raise and through their User Charges or Fees. Since the County is already required by Law to levy sewer district assessments, there are no additional costs in levying the User Charges or Fees. These charges have been spread since the User Charge System was first initiated by the Sewer Districts in 1981.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The Sewer Districts would have to send out separate individual billings to the properties required to pay the User Charges or Fees. This would result in substantial additional costs to the Sewer Districts.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

1. The Director of Real Property Tax Services will spread said charges on the appropriate parcels of lands within the various Erie County Sewer Districts.

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- 2. The Receiver of Taxes will collect the appropriate sums from the various parcels within the County Sewer Districts and transfer them to the County with collection of the annual taxes.
- 3. The Sewer Districts will have sufficient appropriations to meet their budgetary expenditures for the next budget year.
