**Re: Comptroller Subpoenas on Medicaid Recertification Process**

Dear Comptroller Mychajliw:

Yesterday, at approximately 2:10 pm, a letter addressed to you was hand-delivered to your office from the undersigned informing you that the Department of Social Services ("DSS") would continue to cooperate with your new investigation into the Medicaid recertification process and that DSS would make its employees available to your audit staff for interviews on said process.

As you may be aware, your office originally sought to interview six (6) DSS employees, including Commissioner Carol Dankert-Maurer, who were identified as "targets" of the investigation. Then this past Friday your office abruptly and unilaterally contacted eighty (80) DSS employees by electronic mail demanding they make themselves available for interviews by the Comptroller's Office (a copy of the email is enclosed herein). Following the receipt of said electronic mail, DSS Commissioner Carol Dankert-Maurer contacted Deputy Comptroller-Audit Teresa Fraas by electronic mail, copying you, about your office's drastic change in position and how best to cooperate with this request with minimal disruption to ongoing operations and recertifications (a copy of this email is enclosed herein). Ms. Fraas then agreed via electronic mail to schedule all such interviews through management (a copy of this email is enclosed herein).

Finally, in another dramatic development, shortly after receiving my May 8<sup>th</sup> letter reiterating DSS's cooperation with your investigation, members of your staff subsequently delivered eighteen (18) subpoenas to DSS demanding that 18 employees in that department contact you personally to schedule interviews.

I am surprised as to why you have abruptly issued subpoenas when DSS has been very cooperative with your office on two separate audits regarding DSS you are currently engaged in (although it appears you have apparently postponed the Medicaid audit for unknown reasons). As you know, DSS agreed last week, and I reiterated in my letter yesterday, staff would be available for interviews. Given the level of cooperation displayed by DSS so far, it is disappointing that you have chosen to take such a drastic measure that, clearly, was not necessary.



However, by issuing these subpoenas you have initiated a legal process that you now must respect. All DSS employees that were (or will be) subpoenaed retain the right to legal counsel and/or representation by CSEA Local 815 representatives at any interviews. Whether DSS employees chose to exercise those rights is up to them individually. DSS requests that official transcripts of all interviews be provided to the DSS Office of Legal Counsel for compliance and regulatory purposes to ensure that no State or County regulations or policies governing Medicaid customers are violated. Should you choose not to hire a court reporter to provide such transcription services, at minimum, we expect the ability for multiple recording devices to be present during all interviews.

This administration has, and will continue to cooperate with your investigation so long as it is a legitimate inquiry. However, I note once again that your recent actions and inconsistent behavior on this matter is troubling, especially considering we have already provided you and your office proof the County is in compliance with the New York State Department of Health's policies and guidelines regarding recertifying individuals for Medicaid.

I welcome the opportunity to speak with about this issue as I have yet to receive a single response from you to-date about your audit and investigation.

Ms. Fraas,

It has come to my attention that, instead of going through the appropriate management channel, you have contacted approximately 80 DSS Medicaid (MA) employees and you are asking them to meet with you (and perhaps others in the Comptroller's Office) at a specific time, as early as today.

Perhaps you are not aware that our MA staff process over 3,000 applications per month and carry a caseload of over 67,000 cases. As such, MA employees always have time-sensitive case processing assignments that need to be managed and are a clear priority.

Any requests that will take staff away from their primary responsibilities should be directed to their supervisors in DSS prior to attempting to schedule any meetings.
