MEMORANDUM

TO: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature

SUMMARY

The proposed resolution and accompanying memorandum request authorization to make adjustments to the 2013 Erie County Board of Elections budget by creating a new grant account and budget to allow for the purchase of equipment and services required for compliance with the Federal Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA). In addition, the resolution authorizes the Commissioners of the Erie County Board of Elections (ECBOE) to enter into agreement with local municipalities (Appendix A) for the purpose of making State funds available for improvements to publicly owned polling sites to accommodate voters with disabilities.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Purchases of equipment and services will be reimbursed by the State of New York through a federal grant. The County receives 95% federal aid reimbursement and the County is required to make a 5% matching payment. The County has previously made its 5% match payment, therefore all funds expended for purchases of equipment and services will be reimbursed at 100%.

The improvements to the publicly owned polling sites will be paid directly by the municipality and will be 100% reimbursed by NYSBOE. Erie County will serve as a pass through entity.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION & BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) requires the replacement of lever voting machines with electronic voting systems. Title III, Subtitle, A of the Act provides the standards for such systems. Any future purchases of equipment and services will be authorized by New York State to ensure compliance with the Act and the standard prescribed by the State.

The HAVA Act requires and makes funds available for improvement of Polling Place Access in order to expand participation in voting by individuals with a full range of disabilities.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The Board of Elections may experience difficulties in compliance with the Federal and State election HAVA requirements.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Board will work with the Division of Budget and Management to make the necessary adjustments to the 2013 Budget. After purchase of equipment and services, the appropriate claim will be submitted through New York State to recover the 100% reimbursement.

WHEREAS, the Federal legislation Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) requires the replacement of lever voting machines with electronic voting systems; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Board of Elections desires to purchase equipment and services for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of such equipment and services are eligible for 100% reimbursement from the Federal government through the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the ECBOE desire to enter into agreement with local municipalities (Appendix A) for the purpose of making improvements to publicly owned polling sites to accommodate voters with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, such improvements are eligible for 100% reimbursement from the State of New York.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that authorization is granted for the Board of Elections to enter into agreement with local municipalities (Appendix A) in the amount of not to exceed \$211,480.00; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Elections will submit necessary paperwork for state and federal reimbursement for 100% of the purchase price of eligible equipment and services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that authorization is hereby granted to the Division of Budget and Management to create a new grant account and budget and make the following adjustments to the 2013 Budget of the Board of Elections:
