

MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature

Re: United States Environmental Protection Agency Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Grant: "Buffalo River RAP Project Management: Bailey/Smith Habitat Restoration Delisting Project" (October 1, 2013 – September 30, 2016)

SUMMARY

It is recommended that the Legislature approve the attached resolution prepared by the Department of Environment and Planning (DEP) to authorize the County Executive or the Deputy County Executive to execute the necessary agreements to accept \$1,948,464.00 in grant funding, establish a program budget, create an Environmental Compliance Specialist (JG-9) position, and authorize the County Executive or the Deputy County Executive to execute the necessary agreements to enter a 3-year contract with Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper for Buffalo River RAP Project Management. The grant funding is available from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to continue local coordination of the Buffalo River Remedial Action Plan and for the implementation of habitat restoration projects.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be no additional impact on County resources. The requested staff position and program expenses will be funded by the United States Environmental Protection Agency Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Grant.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The anticipated benefits associated with the proposed resolution are as follows:

- Implementing habitat restoration projects, which includes contracts for design and construction for two Erie County Natural Habitat Parks: Baily & Smith Street;
- Continuing local coordination of the Buffalo River Remedial Action Plan; and
- Making progress toward delisting the Buffalo River as an Area of Concern.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Buffalo River was considered biologically dead in the 1960s and was declared as an Area of Concern (AOC) by the International Joint Commission in 1987 due to possible impairments of 14 beneficial uses. Since being designated as an Area of Concern, nine of the fourteen Beneficial Use Impairments (BUIs) in the Buffalo River AOC have been identified as "Impaired". The ultimate goal of the Area of Concern program is to address the causes of the impairments and delist the area as an Area of Concern.

As part of the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Action Plan and Great Lakes Regional Collaboration Strategy, protection and restoration of habitat are priorities for restoring aquatic and upland habitats. These actions lead to a healthy ecosystem that contributes to human health and prosperity, economic and social vitality, and supports sustainable biodiversity. Of utmost

priority is to achieve corrective measures that will eliminate Benefit Use Impairments and move toward delisting of the AOC.

The Buffalo River RAP Project Management: Bailey/Smith Habitat Restoration Delisting Project targets two Erie County Natural Habitat Parks within the Buffalo River corridor for aquatic and riparian habitat restoration work that conforms to delisting criteria for the AOC. Control and management methods for invasive plants will be selected based on the likelihood they can meet restoration goals and objectives within the project-specific timeframes. Final design will likely involve a combination of treatment methods and techniques and will include monitoring protocols to measure results and document biological/habitat outcomes and outputs. The Buffalo River Ecological Restoration Master Plan has articulated the feasibility of these sites as candidates that can be restored to improve fish and wildlife habitat that would eliminate Beneficial Use Impairments. A solid advantage for these two sites is the established community support and stewardship that will help ensure long-term success for the restoration work.

The funding of this program will allow DEP to create an Environmental Compliance Specialist (JG-9) position to manage the work on the habitat sites, as well as fund contractual work with Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper to continue their management of the Buffalo River RAP, as well as contracts for habitat design and construction.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The DEP will forfeit USEPA funding and be unable to address the causes of the impairments to work towards delisting the Buffalo River as an Area of Concern, as well as the resulting healthy ecosystem that contributes to human health and prosperity, economic and social vitality, and supports sustainable biodiversity.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The necessary contracts with USEPA will be executed, a budget will be established, an Environmental Compliance Specialist (JG-9) position will be created, and Erie County will execute a contract with Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper to manage the Buffalo Niagara River RAP. Erie County DEP will manage the habitat restoration contracts at the two Erie County Natural Habitat Parks, as well as oversee the contract with Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper for the Buffalo River RAP management.

WHEREAS, The Erie County Department of Environment and Planning (DEP) has played a crucial role in water quality issues throughout the region for decades and continues to administer many initiatives that protect and preserve our natural water resources; and

WHEREAS, DEP is committed to coordinate, oversee, and support work towards the delisting of the Buffalo River as a Great Lakes Area of Concern; and

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Great Lakes Restoration Initiative provides grant assistance to municipalities to implement projects to improve the quality of the Great Lakes; and

WHEREAS, DEP provides technical assistance regarding the management of the Erie County Natural Habitat Parks; and

WHEREAS, the USEPA approached DEP to apply for the USEPA’s Great Lakes Restoration Initiative funding for continuing local coordination of the Buffalo River Remedial Action Plan and implementing habitat restoration projects; and

WHEREAS, Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper through their past experience successfully managing and coordinating the Buffalo River Remedial Action Plan (RAP) was identified in the USEPA approved work plan as a specific sub-contractor to Erie County to provide these services; and

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) awarded Erie County a Great Lakes Restoration Initiative of \$1,948,464.00 to complete a three-year “Buffalo River RAP Project Management: Bailey/Smith Habitat Restoration Delisting Project”; and

WHEREAS, the addition of this habitat restoration initiative necessitates the execution of a grant contract with the USEPA, the adoption of a grant budget; the creation of an Environmental Compliance Specialist (JG-9) position within the DEP which will be 100 % grant funded; and the execution of a contract with Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive or the Deputy County Executive is hereby authorized to execute the necessary agreements to accept a grant of \$1,948,464.00 from the United States Environmental Protection Agency for the purpose of establishing a three-year “Buffalo River RAP Project Management: Bailey/Smith Habitat Restoration Delisting Project”; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the grant budget and project period for the United States Environmental Protection Agency Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Grant is hereby created in the Department of Environment and Planning, Business Area 162, as follows:
