## MEMORANDUM

**To:** Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature  
**From:** Department of Emergency Services  
**Re:** Acceptance of FY 12 Emergency Management Performance Grant  
**Date:** September 10, 2013

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### **SUMMARY**

It is recommended that the Erie County Legislature approve the attached resolution for the FY 12 Local Emergency Planning Grant that will authorize the County Executive to enter into contract to receive \$340,722.00 in State Assistance.

### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

There is no fiscal impact on the county operating budget. Said grant is 100% reimbursed.

### **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

The Department of Emergency Services will be allowed to manage expenditures for \$340,722.00 in NYS Department of Homeland Security funds and utilize the funds to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

As a result of existing threats to homeland security, New York State has allocated funds to be utilized to improve the ability of local governments to deal effectively with emergency and disaster situations. These funds play an important role in the implementation of Presidential Policy Directive 8 (PPD-8) by supporting the development and sustainment of core capabilities of prevention, protection, mitigation response and recovery within Erie County. Emergency Services continues to work on enhancing the ability of first responders within the county to effectively and efficiently manage emergency and disaster situations.

### **CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION**

Without this Legislation FY 12 Local Emergency Management Performance grant contract will not be signed, the funding will not be received for the Department of Emergency Services and the original purpose of what these funds were intended to be utilized will not be completed.

### **STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL**

The County Executive will sign the contract, the \$340,722.00 in Homeland Security grant funds will be received, and the Department of Emergency Services will fulfill its requirements.

WHEREAS, the NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has agreed to provide funding in the amount of \$340,722.00 in federal assistance to continue the implementation of a program to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations; and

WHEREAS, authorization is required from the Erie County Legislature for the County Executive to enter into contact and accept \$340,722.00 in state resources to provide funding for personnel and the purchase of necessary equipment to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby authorize the County Executive to enter into contract with the NYS Department of Homeland Security to receive \$340,722.00 in grant funding for the Department of Emergency Services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that authorization is hereby provided to transfer currently budgeted positions with existing Department of Emergency Services Homeland Security grants to EMPG FY 12 as required to maintain public safety services to Erie County residents; and be it further

RESOLVED, these funds will be utilized to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the authorization is hereby provided to the Division of Budget and Management to establish funding in the Grant Fund 281, as follows:
