Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Delist Notice

The Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site Program (the State Superfund Program) is the State's program for identifying, investigating, and cleaning up sites where the disposal of hazardous waste may present a threat to public health and/or the environment. The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) maintains a list of these sites in the Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Sites (the "Registry"). NYSDEC has determined that this site ([see map on reverse side](#)) no longer presents a threat to public health or the environment and is proposing to delist the site from the Registry for the following reason(s):

Remedial actions have been implemented and some contamination remains in groundwater and soil. Controls are in place to prevent human exposures, as follows:

- **Soil:** Use and development of this site is restricted to commercial and industrial uses. Residual soil contamination remains along the 100 year old brick sewer line on the site. A deed restriction prohibits ground-intrusive work along the sewer line without appropriate controls, as described in the site management plan.
- **Groundwater:** Groundwater use at the site is restricted without necessary water quality treatment, as determined by NYSDOH or the County Health Department.

Public comments are being received before the decision to remove the site from the Registry is finalized. The public comment period will end September 8, 2013. A summary of any comments will be assembled and made available by the Project Manager.

If we do not receive any new or additional information during this public comment period that changes our delist proposal, we will delist the site on or after September 30, 2013.


