MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature
From: Department of Public Works/Division of Highways
Re: Purchase of Street Sweeper
Date: October 8, 2013

SUMMARY

This resolution requests authorization to purchase a 2004 Johnston VT650 Street Sweeper VIN# 1FVAB6BV45DN91772, for \$25,000 from the Village of Williamsville. Cyncon Equipment, New York State's premier full-service municipal and truck equipment dealer provided an appraisal of the fair market value of this equipment at \$25,000. The Division of Highways will use the street sweeper on County highways and bridges and lots.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The Department of Public Works would purchase the street sweeper using available funds from business area 123, Fund 420, Project(s) B.13022 2013 Highway Vehicle Replacement in the amount of \$2,092 and B.13016 2013 Capital Overlay Program (PAYGO) in the amount of \$22,908.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Department of Public Works currently has only one street sweeper for over 1200 miles of road inventory and requires an additional street sweeper to meet compliance requirements of MS4 and Storm water pollution prevention program. Non-compliance could result in excessive fines and charges. The vehicle is in excellent working condition, reasonably priced, and the purchase of which would benefit to the taxpayers of Erie County.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Village of Williamsville offered Erie County the opportunity to first purchase of the street sweeper as a mutually beneficial courtesy. DPW is in need of this equipment for environmental program compliance as well as for efficient maintenance of its infrastructure.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Erie County DPW would be unable to meet environmental program compliance, and Erie County may face excessive fines and charges for non-compliance.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

DPW with assistance from the Department of Purchase and Division of Fleet will process a sole source purchase order for the equipment, and the appropriate paper work for transfer of the equipment will be completed.

COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE REVIEW

The proposed legislation has been reviewed by the Comptroller's Office and is related to an authorized capital project for which there are sufficient appropriations for the action proposed.
