- 3. Water usage analysis

WHEREAS, Trinity Towers Apartments II, LLC and Hertel Park Senior Housing II, LLC are developing housing for low and very low income households pursuant to Article XI of the New York Private Housing Finance Law; and

WHEREAS, Trinity Towers Senior Housing will consist of the development of 83 rental residential units at 33 Linwood Avenue, Buffalo, New York. The 83 units will be substantially

rehabilitated and the units will be affordable for senior households with incomes at or below 60% of the area median income; and

WHEREAS, Hertel Park Senior Housing will consist of the development of 138 rental residential units at 1631 Hertel Avenue, Buffalo, New York. The 138 units will be substantially rehabilitated and the units will be affordable for senior households with incomes at or below 60% of the area median income; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature adopted a policy on Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) on December 16, 1999, and the PILOT is consistent with said policy; and

WHEREAS, in order to make the Project economically feasible for Trinity Towers Senior Housing II, LLC and Hertel Park Senior Housing II, LLC to operate the housing projects it is necessary to obtain tax relief from the County of Erie and the City of Buffalo.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) Agreement with Trinity Towers Apartments II, LLC, Trinity Tower II Housing Development Fund Corp., Inc. and the City of Buffalo relating to Trinity Towers Senior Housing and all other agreements necessary to conclude this housing project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) Agreement with Hertel Park Senior Housing II, LLC, Hertel Park II Housing Development Fund Corp. and the City of Buffalo relating to Hertel Park Senior Housing and all other agreements necessary to conclude this housing project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that at least 60% of the Trinity Towers Senior Housing units and at least 60% Hertel Park Senior Housing units remain affordable to and occupied by households earning no greater than 60% of the area median income, adjusted for family size, as determined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the period of the Agreements; and be it further

RESOLVED, that said Agreements shall include annual PILOT payments in the amount of taxes due as set forth on Schedule A attached hereto for the Trinity Towers Senior Housing and Schedule B attached hereto for the Hertel Park Senior Housing. Payment under the Agreements will be for fifteen (15) years with the County share of each annual payment being twenty-five (25) percent of the total amount; and be it further

RE: Increase Use of Solar Power in EC (INTRO 16-2)

A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATOR MILLS

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature recognizes that energy from renewable sources, such as solar, wind and hydro, generally is viewed as more environmentally friendly than power generated from sources that take thousands of years to renew; and

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WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature also views energy self-sufficiency as more preferable to dependency on foreign energy sources; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature recognizes the opportunity to promote domestic technological innovation and industrial growth by encouraging the utilization of renewable energy sources; and

WHEREAS, New York State has amended the tax law, in relation to exempting the sale and installation of commercial solar energy systems equipment from state sales and compensating use taxes and granting municipalities the opportunity to enact such exemption from their sales and compensating use taxes; and

WHEREAS, this Legislature desires to encourage the purchase and installation of such commercial solar energy systems equipment in order to promote the use of renewable energy sources and decreased reliance on fossil fuels in an effort to protect the environment; and

WHEREAS, this Legislature wishes to explore the effectiveness and fiscal implications of the local sales and compensating use tax exemption on the sale and installation of commercial solar energy systems equipment on promoting those goals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby express its support of the increased use of solar energy as a clean and renewable source of power; and be it further

RESOLVED, the Finance & Management Committee is hereby directed to hold a meeting with interested parties to discuss the possibility of Erie County exempting the local sales and compensating use tax exemption on the sale and installation of commercial solar energy systems equipment; and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be delivered to the County Executive, the Director of Budget and Management, the Director of Real Property Tax Services and the Mayor or Supervisor of every municipality in Erie County, because each municipality in Erie County is unique in New York State in that it receives a share of sales tax collections.

WHEREAS, Erie County Child Protective Services ("CPS") has been responding to increased allegations of abuse or neglect, as well as more serious situations, such as a growing number of families with multiple allegations; and

WHEREAS, CPS is burdened with a current and growing high caseload and staffing constraints; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Social Services ("DSS") seeks approval to create a new CPS team effective October 1, 2013 and add six (6) Social Caseworker I positions and one (1) Child Protective Coordinator position; and

WHEREAS, the new CPS team will help significantly reduce the caseloads and enable DSS to more expeditiously respond to new allegations and complaints; and

WHEREAS, DSS has a management structure that features few senior level managers and significant burdens imposed on the Commissioner; and

WHEREAS, the DSS management structure features far fewer managers than comparable counties in New York State such as Westchester and Suffolk with corresponding issues; and

WHEREAS, as part of a reorganization, the Department of Social Services seeks approval to create the following three (3) new management confidential positions effective October 1, 2013: First Deputy Commissioner (JG 18), Second Deputy Commissioner (JG 17) and Special Assistant to the Commissioner (JG 15); and

WHEREAS, there is no local share fiscal impact to this resolution as the local share for the CPS team and the management reorganization will be funded by available funds from an unexecuted contract for Vocational Rehabilitation at Erie County Medical Center Corporation for which an unexpended balance of \$162,000 remains within the \$250,000 budgeted appropriation.
