## MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature

Re: Section 520 Exemptions Charges for 2014  
Date: December 3, 2013

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### **SUMMARY**

It is recommended that the Legislature approve the attached resolution providing for the adoption of the Section 520 Exemptions Charges for 2014.

### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

Positive for County and Towns, as taxes due on property receiving total or partial exemption from taxation that has been transferred to a person, corporation or association not entitled to an exemption from taxation shall be levied for said fiscal year.

### **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

Adoption of the Section 520 Exemption Charges for 2014, will allow the Director of Real Property Tax Services to spread the amount of taxes on the rolls of several municipalities where taxes due from exemption removal on properties transferred in the past year.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Real Property Tax Law Section 520 states that any property receiving total or partial exemption from taxation has been transferred to a person, corporation or association not entitled to an exemption from taxation shall be re-levied for said fiscal year.

### **CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION**

Section 520 Exemption removals will not be levied and taxes due from those removals will not be collected.

### **STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL**

520 charges get applied to the affected parcels and included as part of the 2014 Town and County tax levy.
