SUMMARY

The Erie County Legislature is requested to receive and file this communication pertaining to the Department of Environment and Planning's approval of Work Order URS-3 with URS Corporation for consultant services in the amount of \$1,256.63.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This work order does not impact the County's General Fund. The cost for the engineering work related to this communication will be paid from the Erie County Sewer District No. 3 Fund 220 Cost Center 183 Account 516020 professional services.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

URS will provide a complete 3rd party air monitoring for the three pumping stations for asbestos abatement in accordance with the New York State Department of Labor Code Rules of Regulation, Part 56.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On November 8, 2012 the Erie County Legislature passed a resolution authorizing a 3 year term agreement with URS Corporation. At the time of the contract award, the Division of Sewerage Management committed to notifying the Honorable Legislature of each work order issued.

The Term Agreements were approved to expedite solutions for engineering and construction problems, small projects, or to handle emergency situations. For example, on some small projects there is insufficient time or it is economically impractical to prepare an individual Request for Proposals.

Accordingly, the Department has approved Work Order URS-3 with URS Corporation in the amount of \$1,256.63 to provide third party monitoring for three pumping stations asbestos abatement as detailed in Contract No. 40. The actual work will be performed by the MBE firm of Watts Architects and Engineering as a sub-consultant to the URS Corporation.
