SUMMARY

To pass a resolution authorizing the County of Erie to acquire Right-of-Way to facilitate the rehabilitation of the Clark Street Culvert BR 51-1 as part of the Miscellaneous Bridge Repair Project BR-MISC 6-13.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Right-of-Way acquisition phase costs of this project are currently estimated at \$1,650.00 and are available in SAP B.00062, Purchase of Permanent Right-of-Way. Right-of-Way acquisition is recommended for the parcel and will be negotiated within the budgeted allowance.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

To allow the County to acquire necessary Right-of-Way for rehabilitation of the culvert embankment slope.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project has been approved by the Erie County Legislature and the project will be let in the late fall of 2013.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION


This action is required to insure meeting safety standards for rehabilitation of the culvert. Negative action will halt project progress and have detrimental fiscal, health and safety implications.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The County Executive will execute the Contract of Sale and Right-of-Way will be acquired to facilitate reconstruction of the roadway.

COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE REVIEW

The proposed legislation has been reviewed by the Comptroller's Office and is related to an authorized capital project for which there are sufficient appropriations for the action proposed.

**RE: Right-of-Way Acquisition -Miscellaneous Bridge Repairs BR-MISC-6-13
Clark Street Culvert BR 51-1 - Town of Hamburg, Erie County**

WHEREAS, a project for the Miscellaneous Bridge Rehabilitation and Repair Project BR-MISC 6-14, (the "Project") was authorized by this honorable body via Communication 16E-10 (2013); and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate repairs of the Clark Street Bridge (BR 51-1), it will be necessary for the County to acquire the parcel by fee, portions of real property in the vicinity of the structure:

such property to be acquired by the County is herein referred to as the "Subject Property"; and

WHEREAS, in order to acquire the parcel for the project, it will be necessary for the County to establish an amount which it believes to represent just compensation for the real property interest to be acquired and to thereafter make a written offer to purchase the real property interest for the respective just compensation amount; and

WHEREAS, in order to advance the acquisition process, it will be necessary to execute a change order to retain the services of a ROW consultant and D & S Realty Consultants is an approved provider of such services; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of the portion of the Subject Property is de minimis in nature so that the public interest will not be prejudiced by the rehabilitated culvert and other general improvements to the subject section of Clark Street (CR 51); and

WHEREAS, should one or more owners of the Subject Properties refuse to convey such portions of their real property to the County for an amount not exceeding fair market value, it will be necessary for the County to acquire the Subject Property by commencing eminent domain proceedings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature hereby approves the above subject actions; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$1,650.00 is made available from the Purchase of Permanent Right-of-Way, SAP B.00062, to cover the cost of Right-of-Way acquisition; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County of Erie is authorized to acquire the necessary real property interests from the aforementioned Subject Property for the purpose of reconstructing and improving the aforementioned Clark Street Bridge; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County of Erie is authorized to process into a change order with D & S Realty Consultants to provide the ROW services necessary for the acquisition of the required ROW; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Public Works, or his authorized representatives, are hereby authorized to establish the amounts which he believes to represent just compensation for the real property interests to be acquired; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Public Works, or his authorized representatives, are hereby authorized to negotiate and offer just compensation amount to the owners of the Subject Properties for the purpose of acquiring the necessary real property interest in portions of their respective parcel of real property by permanent easement or temporary easement, for the Clark Street Bridge; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Public Works, or his authorized representatives, are authorized to act on behalf of the County of Erie in connection with the acquisition of the portions of the aforementioned Subject Properties; and be it further

RESOLVED, that based upon the factors previously set forth herein, it is the determination of this County Legislature that such acquisition of the aforementioned Subject Properties are de minimis in nature; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Attorney shall prepare and the County Executive shall execute all appropriate documents relating to acquiring fee and/or easement interests in the Subject Properties; and be it further

RESOLVED, should one or more owners of the Subject Properties refuse to convey such portion of their real property to the County for an amount not to exceed the just compensation determined by the Commissioner of Public Works, or his authorized representatives, the County is authorized to commence eminent domain procedures; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature forward three (3) certified copies of this resolution to the Department of Public Works, Office of the Commissioner and also one copy each to the Office of the County Executive, the Division of Budget and Management, and the Office of the Comptroller.
