PROPOSED RESOLUTION

Re: Erie County Sheriff's Office – FY12 Explosive Detection Canine Grant

WHEREAS, the US Department of Homeland Security through the NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has awarded \$15,000 to the Erie County Sheriff's Office to purchase an Explosive Detection Canine and the required canine handling supplies and equipment; and

WHEREAS, authorization is required from the Erie County Legislature for the County Executive to enter into contract and accept these funds; and

WHEREAS, there will be no impact on County Tax dollars.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into contract with the US Department of Homeland Security through the NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services and to accept funding in the amount of \$15,000; and be it further,

RESOLVED, that authorization is hereby provided to the Division of Budget and Management to establish funding in the Grant Fund 281 as follows:

ACCOMPANYING MEMORANDUM

RE: Erie County Sheriff's Office – FY12 Explosive Detection Canine Grant

I. Summary of Recommended Action

The attached resolution requests authorization for the County of Erie to receive funding in the amount of \$15,000 from the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services for the purchase of an Explosive Detection Canine and the necessary canine handling equipment and supplies.

II. Fiscal Implications of Proposal

No impact on County Tax Dollars. The Erie County Sheriff's Office will receive funding in the amount of \$15,000 to purchase an explosive detection canine and to purchase the supplies and equipment required.

III. Reasons for Recommendation

Erie County must remain committed to Homeland Security and protecting the citizens of Erie County. These funds have been awarded to the Erie County Sheriff's Office to further enhance their capability to prevent, detect and respond to improvised explosive device attacks by acquiring and utilizing an explosive detection canine.

IV. Consequence of Negative Action

The County will forfeit \$15,000 in funding that would allow the Sheriff's Office to replace an explosive canine that is nearing the end of his working years and to purchase equipment and supplies as needed.

V. Steps Following Approval of Measure

Certified copies of this resolution will be forwarded to the County Executive's Office, the Division of Budget and Management, the Erie County Comptroller's Office and the Office of the Sheriff.
