MEMORANDUM

SUMMARY

The Department of Emergency Services seeks authorization for the County Executive to enter into a contract to receive \$50,000 in Federal Assistance for the FY 2013 Critical Infrastructure Grant.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no fiscal impact on the county operating budget. Said grant is 100% reimbursed from New York State.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Department of Emergency Services will utilize the \$50,000 in US Department of Homeland Security funds to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

As a result of existing threats to homeland security, the federal government through various State agencies has allocated funds to be utilized to improve the ability of local governments to deal effectively with emergency and disaster situations. There is a need for Erie County to enhance its ability to manage emergency and disaster situations.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without this Legislation the Critical Infrastructure Fiscal Year 2013 contract will not be signed, the funding will not be received for the Department of Emergency Services and the original purpose of what these funds were intended to be utilized to enhance the ability to respond to emergency and disaster related incidents will not be completed.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The County Executive will sign the contract, the \$50,000 in Homeland Security grant funds will be received, and the Department of Emergency Services will fulfill its requirements.

WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security through the NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has agreed to provide funding in the amount of \$50,000 in federal assistance to continue the implementation of hardening critical infrastructure facilities within Erie County preparing for emergency and disaster situations; and

WHEREAS, authorization is required from the Erie County Legislature for the County Executive to enter into contact and accept \$50,000 in federal resources to provide the purchase of necessary equipment to harden critical infrastructure facilities within Erie County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby authorize the County Executive to enter into contract with the NYS Department of Homeland Security to receive \$50,000 in grant funding for the Department of Emergency Services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this grant, under the Department of Emergency Services, will meet the goals and objectives and these funds will be utilized to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the authorization is hereby provided to the Division of Budget and Management to establish funding in the Grant Fund 281, as follows:
