A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATORS MILLER-WILLIAMS & GRANT

RE: Supporting Legislation to Strengthen Staff Qualifications for Caseworkers and Supervisors in Child Protective Services

WHEREAS, reforms within Erie County Child Protective Services are ongoing and meaningful, and together with reforms currently under consideration before the NYS Legislature, aim to strengthen CPS, and promise hope for the future for every child in Erie County; and

WHEREAS, Senate (S.6343)/Assembly (A.8429), upon enactment would require future CPS caseworkers and supervisors to have a higher level of education, "expertise and relevant background," and experience in order to meet staff qualification requirements, and the bill does not affect the current CPS workforce; and

WHEREAS, modernizing current State law concerning staff qualifications for CPS caseworkers and supervisors offer a CPS workforce with a real-world mindset, higher education and more experience in substance abuse/chemical dependency, the criminal justice system, psychology and severe mental illness, and can result in better outcomes when child abuse is suspected and investigated, and in the developing of a plan of action when a child is determined to be abused and/or maltreated; and

WHEREAS, receiving formal training to better understand, recognize and react to significant and severe mental illness, domestic violence, long-term poverty, and the other sociological and psychological matters that frequently surround cases involving child abuse are crucial to reforming and modernizing Child Protective Services; and

WHEREAS, having witnessed heart-wrenching tragedy in our community provides the Erie County Legislature a strong and affected voice in requesting passage of this legislation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that this Legislative Body goes on record in support of Senate Bill S.6343, and Assembly Bill A.8429: "An act to amend the social services law, in relation to staff qualifications for non-supervisory and supervisory child protective services workers," as stated in the legislation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature declares that this legislation offers an additional measure of reform to CPS, is prudent, meaningful and good public policy, and together with other legislation also under consideration in Albany, will help CPS significantly; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward certified copies of this resolution to the Governor of the State of New York, the Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo; the Coalition Co-Majority Leaders of the New York State Senate, the Honorable Dean G. Skelos and the Honorable Jeff Klein; the Speaker of the New York State Assembly, the Honorable Sheldon Silver; the Democratic Conference Leader of the New York State Senate, the Honorable Andrea Stewart-Cousins; the Erie County Executive, the Honorable Mark C. Poloncarz; the WNY Delegation to the New York State Legislature; and the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services.
