COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, Erie County child protective services (“CPS”) investigates reports alleging child abuse or neglect; and

WHEREAS, Erie County CPS has been focused on improving its practice after a November 2013 audit by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (“OCFS”) noted areas in need of improvement; and

WHEREAS, the improvement process has resulted in an increase in caseloads; and

WHEREAS, in February 2014, the OCFS issued an audit lauding the improved standard of practice of Erie County CPS, but noting the need to reduce its backlog of cases; and

WHEREAS, Erie County has implemented numerous initiatives to reduce CPS caseloads, such as increasing access to overtime, transferring positions from other divisions within the Department of Social Services to CPS, and providing child protection workers with additional supports; and

WHEREAS, Erie County has come to an agreement with Civil Service Employees Association Local 815 to allow qualified retired child protection workers, who left the County in good standing, to return temporarily as part-time employees for the purpose of reducing the current caseloads; and

WHEREAS, this arrangement will allow Erie County to have adequate manpower to reduce its caseloads while maintaining a high standard of practice; and

WHEREAS, this arrangement is expected to be temporary; and

WHEREAS, after a survey of qualified retired child protection workers, there is a great deal of enthusiasm among qualified persons to return caseloads to an adequate level.

WHEREAS, Erie County Department of Social Services has excess funds in the Other Expenses budget line earmarked for expenses it will no longer incur.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the following budget amendments are hereby authorized in the 2014 Adopted Budget in order to create six (6) positions of Part-Time Child Protective Worker (JG8-E) in the Department of Social Services:

WHEREAS, the Department of Senior Services has available \$49,650 of unused budgetary appropriations in the 163EISEP1314 grant's Home Care line (account #516026), which can be used to fund a one-time increase in the subcontract agencies contracts; and

WHEREAS, Department budgeted EISEP funding for these agencies has not increased since 2011, due to flat and declining EISEP grant funding from NY State; and

WHEREAS, unused appropriations from the EISEP1314 grant, which expires on March 31, 2104, automatically revert back to NY State; and

WHEREAS, the agencies will use this one time increase in their EISEP funding to improve case management services they provide to seniors, and cover additional expenses they have or will incur during the grant's fiscal year, which exceed the current contract amounts; and

WHEREAS, the additional amount each agency is to receive equals \$3,000 plus \$1,000 for each full time equivalent case manager and project coordinator currently funded by the Department of Senior Services; and

WHEREAS, the 163EISEP1314 grant budget needs to be amended.

2. INTRO. 5-6 (2014)
GRANT

WHEREAS, the controversial proposal to provide a taxpayer-paid college education to New York State prison inmates has created an understandable pushback from residents wary of the expenditure of scarce public dollars during tight fiscal times, that if implemented, would help those in society who by the crimes they have committed are viewed as undeserving of such a benefit; and

WHEREAS, the proposal by Gov. Cuomo certainly offers a noble endpoint, that is providing prison inmates with a higher level of education in order to leave prison with the education and skill set necessary for today’s economy, and thereby never returning to a life of crime with an all too often return to prison – which at a tremendous cost to law-abiding taxpayers in terms of victimization and suffering, theft and property damage, and the public tax dollars spent on repeated incarcerations, begs for some type of ‘out-of-the-box’ thinking; and

WHEREAS, the debate no doubt represents a paradox, in that studies comparing education to recidivism point to higher education keeping people out of prison, yet a taxpayer-funded program to grant such an education does not enjoy significant public support; and

WHEREAS, opposition is understandable in light of New York families struggling to put their children through college without public tax dollars – students who did not break the law, and who nonetheless find that not only is college becoming ever more costly, they also find that government-funded programs to help pay for college are being slashed, and eligibility for need-based government assistance is also being tightened; and

WHEREAS, indeed, with NYSUNY 2020 leading to higher tuition costs for a lot of students, SUNY funding cuts resulting in reductions in programming, funding reductions to the Tuition Assistance Program and smaller TAP allowances, Albany policymakers must explore alternatives to the Cuomo proposal, such as placing the burden of payment for a college education on the people receiving the college education – the inmates themselves; and

WHEREAS, exploring the concept of a student loan program has merit in that such an approach would achieve the goal set forth by Gov. Cuomo, to offer college-level coursework, and the hope that by doing so that a different and more favorable outcome could ensue; and that such an inmate student loan program would also shift the financial burden away from everyday taxpayers who should not have to bear such a cost.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that consideration of alternative ways to fund a proposal by Gov. Cuomo to restore college education in the State's prison system be sought by Albany policymakers, in the hope that by providing the inmate population with the tools necessary in today's society to secure meaningful employment and become productive, law-abiding members of our community, that better outcome can be achieved, a higher quality of life can be realized by former inmates, and that the recidivism rate can be reduced; and be it further

RESOLVED, that while seeking alternatives in funding, that the Erie County Legislature believes policy makers should consider a college loan program – not a gift of public tax dollars and not unlike college loans outside prison – whereby once an inmate completes his or her sentence and secures gainful employment, that the student loan can then begin to be repaid; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward certified copies of this resolution to the Governor of the State of New York, the Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo; the Coalition Co-Majority Leaders of the New York State Senate, the Honorable Dean G. Skelos and the Honorable Jeff Klein; the Speaker of the New York State Assembly, the Honorable Sheldon Silver; the Democratic Conference Leader of the New York State Senate, the Honorable Andrea Stewart-Cousins; the Erie County Executive, the Honorable Mark C. Poloncarz; the President of the Buffalo Common Council, the Honorable Darius G. Pridgen; the Honorable Members of the WNY Delegation to the New York State Legislature; Mr. Jeffrey M. WHEREAS, the State of New York State amended the Tax Law, in relation to exempting the sale and installation of commercial solar energy equipment from state sales and compensating use taxes and granting municipalities the option to elect such exemption from their sales and compensating use taxes; and

WHEREAS, the County of Erie recognizes that the use of clean, renewable energy sources, such as solar energy, has many benefits, including in-state and in-county production opportunities such as use of local solar technology manufacturers and installers, minimal environmental impacts, increased income for local, in-state and in-county producers and retailers, economic development support, and dramatic air quality improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Legislature desires to encourage the purchase and installation of such commercial solar energy systems equipment in order to promote the use of renewable energy sources and decreased reliance on fossil fuels in an effort to protect the environment; and

WHEREAS, Erie County has previously exempted the sale and installation of residential solar energy systems from sales and compensating use tax by resolution in 2008.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature amends the Erie County Sales and Use Tax Resolution which imposes taxes on the sales and uses of tangible personal property and on certain services, and on occupancy of hotel rooms, admission charges and club dues, pursuant to Article 29 of the Tax Law of the State of New York, to provide exemptions from sales and compensating use taxes for receipts from sales of, and consideration given or contracted to be given for, or the use of, property and services exempt from the State sales and compensating use taxes pursuant to subdivision (ii) of section 1115 of the Tax Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 1. Section six of the Erie County Sales and Use Tax Resolution, being a resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Erie as Item No.8, of Meeting Number 31, held on July 27, 1965, Supervisors Proceedings, page 666, as amended, is amended by adding a new subdivision (k) to read as follows:

(k) Receipts from sales of and consideration given or contracted to be given for, or for the use of, commercial solar energy systems equipment and installation services exempt from state sales and compensating use taxes pursuant to subdivision (ii) of section 1115 of the New York Tax Law shall also be exempt from sales and compensating use taxes imposed in this jurisdiction.

SECTION 2. This resolution shall take effect June 1, 2014, and shall apply to sales made, services rendered and uses occurring on and after that date in accordance with applicable transitional provisions in sections 1106 and 1217 of the New York Tax Law.

WHEREAS, local governments are responsible for not issuing local permits on Primary Highway System segments of said Scenic Byway route and should consider the impact of issuing permits for off-premise signs for county and local roads not on the primary systems to the goals of the byway, and;

WHEREAS, Scenic Byway communities have opportunities to consider and implement alternative means to direct visitors and residents to find sites, shops, lodging and attractions as they travel along the byway routes, including legal-off-premise signage through the NYSDOT's Tourism Orientated Directional Signage (TODS); and

WHEREAS, the Western New York Southtowns Scenic Byway was approved in 2008 along existing roadways, in the "Southtowns" of Erie County, including roads in the Towns of Orchard Park, Aurora, Colden, Concord, and Boston and the incorporated Villages of Orchard Park, East Aurora, and Springville; for inclusion on the list of New York State Scenic Byways; and
