Erie County Public Health Lab – Revised Testing Schedule

#### MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature

Re: Erie County Public Health Lab Revised Testing Schedule

**Date:** May 5, 2015

#### **SUMMARY**

Authorization is requested to modify the existing fee schedule for the Erie County Public Health Lab to better reflect new costs, and also to allow the department to perform new testing services which have been recently developed and implemented with new technology.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Positive. The new fee schedule will allow the Department to more accurately bill for current tests and to offer new tests to the community.

#### REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Over the past year, the Erie County Department of Health has taken steps to make the Erie County Public Health Lab become more fiscally sound and relevant to the community as a regional testing center for public health needs. This newly adjusted fee schedule represents the fiscal side of this equation.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Article VI of the New York State Public Health Law requires local municipalities seeking state reimbursement to make their best effort to charge fees comparable to their actual costs of providing services. As a result, the Erie County Department of Health must periodically reevaluate the fees it charges for various services, including laboratory testing.

Careful research of internal costs, as well as the laboratory testing market was conducted to generate a fee schedule that would not only meet New York State Article VI requirements, but also remain fair and reasonable to the community at large who rely upon these testing services.

In addition to modifying existing fees, this revised schedule also includes new tests which the Erie County Public Health Lab can now conduct, allowing us to provide even more services to Western New York.

#### **CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION**

The Public Health Lab would be unable to offer many of the new tests that it is capable of preforming and in addition, would be dramatically undercharging for many of its existing tests.

### STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Health Department will work with the Division of Budget and Management, the Department of Information and Support Services and the Comptroller's Office to implement this request and take the appropriate steps necessary to implement the new fee schedule.

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#### A RESOLUTION SUBMITTED BY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

RE: Revised Fee Schedule-Erie County Department of Health Public Health Laboratory

WHEREAS, New York State Public Health Law, Article 6, require that in order for a county to receive State Aid it must charge for services at a rate comparable to the cost of providing these services; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Health Department currently charges fees for Environmental Health, Medical Examiner, Public Health Laboratory and Clinical services under a fee schedule; and

WHERAS, the proposed amended fee schedule will generate revenues, which will be directly applied to offset the cost of providing these programs; and

WHERAS, it is estimated that this action will result in an annual revenue increase of approximately \$45,000 above the existing fee schedule, all of which will be utilized in the Department of Health.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature herby adopts the proposed fee schedule revisions effective June 1, 2015 for the Erie County Department of Health as follows:
