MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature

Re: Acceptance and Distribution of FEMA Aid to Fire Departments
Date: July 10, 2015

SUMMARY

The Department of Emergency Services is seeking authorization for the County Executive to accept and distribute FEMA aid and possible forthcoming State aid received on behalf of the Volunteer Fire Departments that assisted Erie County during the November 2014 winter storm Knife.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None for the County; positive for fire departments.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Volunteer Fire Departments that assisted Erie County during the 2014 November Storm disaster incurred costs that FEMA aid will cover. FEMA aid covers 75% of the allowable claimed expenditures. The State may also cover the additional 25% of allowable claimed expenditures. By accepting the available aid and distributing it to the participating Volunteer Fire Departments, they can be made whole for their storm related expenses.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

During November 2014, record amounts of snow fell in Western New York over a five day period. Erie County found it difficult to keep up with these record amounts. Many Volunteer Fire Departments assisted Erie County during this time and incurred expenses which Erie County submitted to FEMA on their behalf. FEMA is reimbursing allowable expenditures at 75% and the State may reimburse the remaining 25% of the allowable expenditures.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The aid from the 2014 November Storm will not be accepted on behalf of the Volunteer Fire Departments and they will not be able to be reimbursed for their costs.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The County Executive will accept the available aid and be able to reimburse the Volunteer Fire Departments.
