A RESOLUTION SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATOR PATRICK B. BURKE

RE: Inclusion of Poland in the Visa Waiver Program

WHEREAS, The Visa Waiver Program (VWP) allows citizens of participating countries to travel to the United States without a visa for stays of 90 days or less, as long as they meet all necessary requirements; and

WHEREAS, Poland is the only central European country not accepted into the United States Visa Waiver Program; and

WHEREAS, the emergence of the Polish economy has dramatically reduced the likelihood that Polish nationals will overstay their visa term; and

WHEREAS, including Poland in the Visa Waiver Program would improve U.S.—Poland relations; and

WHEREAS, there are approximately 9 million Americans of Polish ancestry in the U.S. with Erie County having 168,000, one of the largest populations of Polish ancestry outside of Warsaw, Poland; and

WHEREAS, Poland has been a staunch ally of U.S. foreign policy over the past decade; and

WHEREAS, an increase in travel between U.S. and Poland could improve security because of the intelligence sharing agreements required by the Visa Waiver Program; and

WHEREAS, South Korea, which generates significantly more illegal immigration than Poland, was awarded Visa Waiver Program privilege; and

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, The Erie County Legislature implores the Bureau of Consular Affairs to improve the equitability of the Visa Waiver Program and allow for Poland to participate in the Visa Waiver Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution are sent to the Bureau of Consular Affairs, Congressman Brian Higgins, Congresswoman Louise Slaughter, Senator Kirsten Gillibrand, and Senator Charles Schumer.
