The Department has been awarded \$136,500 in 100% State share funds to continue and enhance a program entitled Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children. This proposed resolution authorizes the Department to amend the 2015 Adopted Budget and to renew a contract with the International Institute as the lead agency for this program funding. As this is the third year of a newly established program, this proposed resolution seeks Legislative authority to waive section 19.08 of the County Administrative Code which otherwise requires that a Request for Proposals (RFP) be conducted.

The State legislature passed the Safe Harbor for Exploited Children Act. A key provision of the Act is to move sexually exploited youth from the criminal and juvenile justice systems to the family court where children and their families can receive support and services from the child welfare system. Services are to be provided to victims of sex trafficking, and core elements of the service include case management, emergency temporary housing, health care, mental health counseling, language interpretation and translation services, job training and placement and services to assist in establishing permanent residence.

SUMMARY

This proposed resolution authorizes the Department to amend the 2015 Adopted Budget and to renew a contract with the International Institute as the lead agency for this program funding.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Department has been awarded \$136,500 in 100% State share funds to continue and enhance a program entitled Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children. Services are to be provided to victims of sex trafficking and core elements of the service include case management, emergency temporary housing, health care, mental health counseling, language interpretation and translation services, job training and placement and services to assist in establishing permanent residence.

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Social Services and/or the County Executive are hereby authorized to enter into a subcontract with the International Institute in order to implement the Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children program; and be it further
