SUMMARY

The Department of Emergency Services is seeking authorization for the County Executive to enter into a contract with The Research Foundation for State University of New York to conduct a Commodity Flow Study on Hazardous Material Transport through Erie County utilizing the FY 15 Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness grant and county share previously approved in Comm. 9E-12 (2016), 5/26/16.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The only fiscal implication to the county's operating budget is the required local match to the FY 15 Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness grant already approved in the above mentioned resolution. The contract is valued at \$17,000.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Department of Emergency Services sent out an RFP for this Commodity Flow study. The Research Foundation for State University of New York is the only agency to respond to the RFP. Therefore, Emergency Services would like to utilize them as the contractor to conduct the Hazardous Material Transportation Commodity Flow Study.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Emergency Services has received homeland security funds to assist the region in preparing for natural or man-made disasters. This study will inform the first responders as to what is being transported on rail lines through their communities. It will give them the knowledge to create training plans for their agencies should a disaster along the rail ever occur. It will also help Emergency Services and the first response agencies to create and update their plans to better prepare for a rail disaster.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without this Legislation the Department of Emergency Services will not be able to hire this contractor and meet the deliverable of the grant.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Department of Emergency Services will be allowed to hire the consultant to perform the study.

WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security through the NYS Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has agreed to provide funding in federal assistance to continue the implementation of programs to enhance the ability of Erie County to manage emergency and disaster situations; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive needs authorization to enter into a contract for \$17,000 with The Research Foundation for State University of New York to conduct a Commodity Flow Study on Hazardous Material Transport through Erie County; and

WHEREAS, there is funding available in the previously approved FY 15 Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grant Program via Comm. 9E-12 (2016), 5/26/16, to cover the costs incurred for this study; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Emergency Services sent out an RFP for this Commodity Flow study and The Research Foundation for State University of New York is the only agency to respond to the RFP; and

WHEREAS, the contract will be managed by the Erie County Department of Emergency Services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby authorize the County Executive to enter into a contract with The Research Foundation for State University of New York, in the amount of \$17,000, to conduct a Commodity Flow Study on Hazardous Material Transport through Erie County. Funds are available in the Department of Emergency Services 2016 Budget, Fund 110, Professional Service Contract and Fees, Account 516020; and be it further
