SUMMARY

The Erie County Medical Examiner's Office was constructed in the late 1960's and has not been updated to current standards. Currently, the Toxicology Laboratory renovation is Phase 4 of the long-range Master Plan.

On May 31, 2017, the Department of Public Works received bid proposals for the Erie County Examiner's Office Toxicology Laboratory Renovation. This resolution is requesting the County Executive to enter into an Agreement Amendment with Trautman Associates for additional asbestos, design and air monitoring services, and issue construction contracts to the lowest responsible bidders, so the work can start.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Funds are currently available from the approved, as amended Capital Budgets, Fund 410, BA 122, SAP Projects as follows:

A.16024-2016 - Renovations to Toxicology Lab

A.20904-2009 - Space Allocation

A.20903-2009 - Countywide Fire Alarm & Security

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

An overhaul of the existing Medical Examiner's Laboratory is necessary for accreditation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Medical Examiner's Toxicology Laboratory is mostly original from the 1960's and does not meet current standards for accreditation

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The Medical Examiner's Toxicology Laboratory will not be replaced leaving the laboratory without proper working environment for Laboratory accreditation.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The County Executive shall enter into an agreement with the lowest responsible bidders so the work can proceed, and execute a contract amendment with Trautman Associates for additional services.

COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE REVIEW

The proposed legislation has been reviewed by the Comptroller's Office and is related to an authorized capital project for which there are sufficient appropriations for the action proposed.
