SUMMARY

The Department of Public Works requests authorization to transfer funds between accounts within the 2017 Operating Budget for the Division of Highways in order to purchase clothing and equipment required to comply with Public Employee Safety and Health ("PESH") and Occupational Safety and Health Administration ("OSHA") standards and to provide formalized training for the employees.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This resolution results in no increase to the Budget. Funds are available in the adopted 2017 Operating Budget.

REASON/BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The transfer of funds will allow the Division of Highways to purchase the clothing and equipment required to comply with PESH and OSHA requirements. The County is developing personal protective clothing and equipment policy, which are in line with PESH regulations. Also included in the policy is formal training for the staff to utilize the new equipment properly.

The Division of Highways also has oil-water separators installed at various locations, all of which need to be cleaned and certified. The various locations and type of work will require a contract be in place through the Department of Purchasing.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The Division of Highways will be unable to procure equipment needed and could be subject to fines or worse yet, injured employees. Storm water regulations require oil-water separators to be certified.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Division of Highways will initiate the transfer of funds in coordination with the Division of Budget and Management.

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works intends to purchase clothing and equipment required for compliance with Public Employee Safety and Health ("PESH") and Occupational Safety and Health Administration ("OSHA") requirements and to clean and certify the oil-water separators in various Highway Facilities; and

WHEREAS, in order to effectuate this purchase, it is necessary to transfer funds to the appropriate budget line; and

WHEREAS, funding for the needed transfers is available in BA 123, Fund 210, Account 506400, Highway Supplies, in the 2017 operating budget.
