### MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature

Re: Amend 2017-18 Appropriations for Case Management Contract Agencies

Date: March 20, 2017

### SUMMARY

The attached resolution requests authorization to amend the Department of Senior Services appropriations for case management contract agencies in the 163CSE1718 and 163EISEP1718 grant budgets. One agency, Concerned Ecumenical Ministries Inc. (CEM), has decided to discontinue providing case management services for the Department of Senior Services after March 31, 2017. To ensure existing CEM case managed clients are covered beginning April 1, 2017, the Department of Senior Services has arranged with People Inc. to perform the work. This also included the review and restructuring of caseloads which allow for shifting case management appropriations from the 163CSE1718 grant to the 163EISEP1718 grant.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No additional county funds are required.

## **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

With CEM ceasing to provide case management services after March 31, 2017, it is necessary for the Department of Senior Services to take steps to ensure that the CEM caseload will be covered beginning April 1, 2017.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Department of Senior Services has been contracting with seven not for profit agencies to provide case management services to seniors within different areas of the County. The annual contracts, which follow an April 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup> fiscal year, are funded through both the Department's CSE and EISEP grants.

One of the agencies, CEM, has decided to discontinue providing case management services for the Department of Senior Services, upon the expiration of its current contract on March 31, 2017. To ensure continuity of service for the existing CEM caseload, the Department of Senior Services has chosen one of the remaining agencies, People Inc., to take over the work beginning April 1, 2017.

The change in agencies results in a \$67,688 cash savings for the Department of Senior Services, but a loss of \$37,465 of contract match that CEM had been providing out of its own funds. The contract match will be made up by recognizing a like amount of overmatch that another case management agency, the Town of Amherst, has been providing.

In an effort to operate more efficiently, the Department of Senior Services has also reviewed and restructured caseloads which allow for a shift of contract agency appropriations from the 163CSE1718 grant to the 163EISEP1718 grant. This will help to ensure that the use of EISEP grant dollars is maximized and that the dollar savings are now in the CSE grant, where they can be used to offset potential State and Federal funding reductions.

# **CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION**

After April 1, 2017 the Department of Senior Services would be unable to provide case management services to seniors formerly served by CEM.

# STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Department of Senior Services will amend the 163EISEP1718 and 163CSE1718 budgets and will contract with People Inc. to provide case management services in the area formerly served by CEM.

WHEREAS, the Department of Senior Services has been annually contracting with seven not for profit agencies to provide case management services for seniors within different areas of the County; and

WHEREAS, the case management contracts, which follow an April 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup> fiscal year, are funded through both the Department's CSE and EISEP grants; and

WHEREAS, one of the agencies, Concerned Ecumenical Ministries Inc. (CEM) has elected not to continue providing case management services for the Department of Senior Services after its existing contract expires March 31, 2017; and

WHEREAS, to ensure continuity of service for the existing CEM caseload after March 31, 2017, the Department of Senior Services has chosen one of the remaining case management contract agencies, People Inc. to take over the work beginning April 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the change in agencies results in a \$67,688 cash savings, but a loss of \$37,465 of contract match that CEM had been providing out of its own funds, which will be made up by recognizing a like amount of overmatch that, another case management agency, the Town of Amherst, has been providing; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to operate more efficiently, the Department of Senior Services has also reviewed and restructured caseloads which will allow for a shift of contract agency appropriations from the 163CSE1718 grant to the 163EISEP1718 grant, thereby helping to ensure that the use of EISEP grant dollars is maximized and that the dollar savings are now in the CSE grant, where they can be used to offset potential State and Federal funding reductions; and

WHEREAS, the 163CSE1718 and 163EISEP1718 grant budgets need to be amended to reflect the above changes to the grants.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, the County Executive be and is hereby authorized to contract with People Inc. to take over cases formerly covered by CEM for the period April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018; and be it further
