Summary of Recommended Action

The attached resolution requests authorization for the County Executive and the Erie County Sheriff's Division of Correctional Health (DoCH) to enter into a three-year agreement with Wolters Kluwer for ten (10) medical database subscriptions to "*Up To Date*." The resolution also seeks authorization to waive Section 19.08 of the Erie County Administrative Code to secure these services.

Fiscal Implications of Proposal

\$12,380.00; funds have been approved in the 2018 Budget, and the same are included the DoCH 2019 Proposed Budget.

Reasons for Recommendation

The DoCH seeks to provide quality health care by utilizing the latest medical information and practices available. The *Up To Date* medical database utilizes tests cases, medical journals, subject matter experts to provide up to date information for patient care. Since the DoCH provides care for approximately 20,000 individual per year and treats both acute and chronic health conditions; the medical staff needs the most current information for diagnosis and treatment for a multitude of health conditions.

Up To Date has become the premier medical database and application for medical research into acute and chronic health conditions. This application and reference tool for the medical profession has become the community and industry standard and is utilized by area hospitals. In addition to providing care standards and current medical research to subscribers, *Up To Date* subscribers earn CME credits necessary for medical and nursing licenses.

The DoCH has been working with the Division of Purchasing since January to identify multiple vendors that provide the same service and medical information, but none matched the criteria set by the DoCH. And since Wolters and Kluwer does not issue "Sole Source Letters," the DoCH and the Division of Purchasing are seek a waiver of Section 19.08 of the Erie County Administrative Code.

Consequence of Negative Action

The Erie County Sheriff's DoCH would lack access to important and the most current medical information to treat acute and chronic health conditions. Furthermore, the DoCH would fall behind area medical care providers who utilize *Up To Date* subscriptions.

Steps Following Approval of Measure

Certified copies of the approved resolution are sent to the County Executive, the County Attorney, the Division of Purchasing, the Erie County Comptroller's Office, and the Chief of Administration of the Sheriff's Office for implementation.
