Re: Calling for Voting Transit-Dependent Members on the NFTA Board of Commissioners

WHEREAS, the majority of Niagara Frontier Transportation Authority (NFTA) riders/users are low-income residents known as 'Captive Riders' who live in areas where there is limited NFTA service; and

WHEREAS, for many years, patrons who use NFTA buses have expressed concern with limited or poor service, infrequent buses, schedule problems, and a lack of accessibility for users to get from their homes to locations where people work and employers are desperately seeking employees, resulting in a lack of job opportunities in certain communities and in some cases, employers to withdraw from the local market; and

WHEREAS, in order to best address the needs of the NFTA's riders, input from a 'Captive Rider' voting representative on the Board of Commissioners would provide valuable opportunities for transit-dependent users to have a seat at the table and to help educate NFTA management and commissioners on the needs of their patrons; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the lack of rider input on the Board of Commissioners, there is also a lack of participation and transparency at NFTA public hearings and board meetings that hinders input from the public as well and blocks riders and the public from having a voice to share their concerns and ask questions to NFTA management and the Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, to help address the 'Captive Rider' issue and a lack of a transit voice on the voting membership of the NFTA Board of Commissioners, Senate Bill S.5106 has been introduced in the New York State Senate by Senator Timothy Kennedy to add two voting members to the NFTA Board of Commissioners who are transit-dependent and para-transit-dependent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature does hereby support the concept of adding a 'Captive Rider' voting member to the NFTA Board of Commissioners who has shown an extreme commitment to community service and is a resident of an Erie County community lacking quality NFTA services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Honorable Body expresses support for S.5106 and the intention behind adding two voting members to the NFTA Board of Commissioners to represent the transit community and para-transit community who use NFTA bus services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Andrew Cuomo, the Western New York delegation of the State Legislature, NFTA Executive Director Kimberley A. Minkel, NFTA Board of Commissioners Chair Denise A. Roche, and any other party deemed necessary and proper.

AN ACT to amend the public authorities law, in relation to various transportation authorities

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 1299-a of the public authorities law is amended by adding two new subdivisions 18 and 19 to read as follows:

'Transit dependent" shall mean an individual who is public transit as their primary mode of transportation because the individual, (a) has no means of private transportation; (b) is elderly (over age 65); (c) is a youth (under age 18); or (d) lives below the poverty or median income levels as defined by the U.S. Census Bureau.

19. "Para-transit dependent" shall mean an individual who is limited

public transit as their primary mode of transportation and who has

either a permanent or temporary disability.

§ 2. Subdivision 1 of section 1299-c of the public authorities law, as amended by chapter 220 of the laws of 2012, paragraph (c) as amended by chapter 176 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows: 14

1. (a) There is hereby created the "Niagara Frontier transportation authority." The authority shall be a body corporate and politic constituting a public benefit corporation. The authority shall consist of a chairman, [ten] not more than twelve other members and shall have two one-voting members as described in paragraphs (b) and (c) of this subdivision appointed by the governor by and with the advice and consent of the senate. The chairman and all members shall be residents of the district. Of the [ten] members other than the chairman, one shall be appointed upon the written recommendation of the Erie county executive [and], one shall be appointed upon the written recommendation of the Erie county legislature, at least one shall be appointed as a represen-

tative of the transit dependent community and at least one shall be appointed as a representative of the para-transit dependent community, as described in paragraph (d) of this subdivision. The chairman and each of the members shall be appointed for a term of eight years, provided however, that the chairman first appointed shall serve term ending June thirtieth, mineteen hundred seventy-three, and of the eight other members first appointed, one shall serve for a term ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred sixty-eight, two shall serve for a term ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred sixty-nine, one shall serve for a term ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred seventy, two shall serve for a term ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred seventy-one, one shall serve for a term ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred seventy-two and one shall serve for a term ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred seventy-three. The term of one of the members appointed to memberships first created by law after April first, nineteen hundred sixty-nine shall end on June thirtieth, nineteen hundred seventy-four, and the term of the other such member shall end on June thirtieth, nine-teen hundred seventy-five. Following the expiration of any term ending on or after June thirtieth, nineteen hundred eighty-seven, each member shall be appointed for a term of five years beginning on the day after the expiration date of such prior term; provided, however, that the term of the member first appointed upon the written recommendation of the Erie county executive and the term of the member first appointed upon the written recommendation of the Erie county legislature shall be for a term ending on June thirtieth, nineteen hundred ninety-six.

(b) The first non-voting member of the authority who shall not be considered in determining a quorum, shall be recommended to the governor by the labor organization representing the plurality of the employees within the authority and shall be a resident of the Niagara Frontier transportation district as described in section twelve hundred ninetynine-b of this title. Such first non-voting member shall be appointed for a term of eight years, provided, however, that if at any time during the term of appointment such non-voting member ceases to be affiliated with the labor organization representing the plurality of employees within the authority, then such labor organization may at any time during such term recommend a new member to the governor who shall serve the remainder of the term. If the local bargaining unit decertifies its existing union affiliation and certifies a new union, the union which represents the plurality of the employees may recommend a new member to the governor who shall serve the remainder of the term. The chairman of the authority, at his or her discretion, may exclude such non-voting member from attending any portion of a meeting of the authority or of any committee held for the purpose of discussing negotiations with labor organizations, pending litigation involving the labor organization, or the investigation, evaluation, or discipline of an employee.

(c) There shall also be a second non-voting member of the authority, who shall not be considered in determining a quorum. The second non-voting member shall be appointed by the governor as a representative of the transit dependent community and/or people with disabilities. The second non-voting member shall be appointed for a term of five years.

(d) There shall be at least two members of the authority appointed by the governor as representatives of the transit dependent and para-transit dependent community. The governor shall make initial appointments to the authority in such number and from lists submitted as follows: at least two members shall be appointed to the authority from a list of not less than four names, submitted to the governor by local and statewide

advocacy organizations. The members shall be residents of a county described in paragraph (a) of this subdivision. The members shall be appointed for a term of five years. If a vacancy shall occur for these member positions, a replacement shall be appointed within six months.

3. Section 1299-bb of the public authorities law is amended by adding two new subdivisions 25 and 26 to read as follows:

'Transit dependent" shall mean an individual who is limited to public transit as their primary mode of transportation because the individual, (a) has no means of private transportation; (b) is elderly (over age 65); (c) is a youth (under age 18); or (d) lives below the poverty or median income levels as defined by the U.S. Census Bureau.

26. "Para-transit dependent" shall mean an individual who is limited

to public transit as their primary mode of transportation and who has either a permanent or temporary disability.

§ 4. Subdivision 1 of section 1299-dd of the public authorities law,

as amended by chapter 388 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as 18 follows:

1. (a) There is hereby created the Rochester-Genesee regional transportation authority. The authority shall be a body corporate and politic constituting a public benefit corporation. It shall consist of at least one member from each county that elects to join the authority except that the county of Monroe shall have seven members of whom three shall be appointed from the city of Rochester and four at large from the county of Monroe and shall have one non-voting member as described in paragraph (b) of this subdivision, at least one shall be appointed as representative of the transit dependent community and at least one shall be appointed as a representative of the para-transit dependent community, as described in paragraph (c) of this subdivision. The members shall be appointed by the governor by and with the advice and consent of the senate. The governor shall make initial appointments to the authority in such number and from lists submitted as follows: three members shall be appointed to the authority from a list of not less than six names, all of whom must be residents of the city of Rochester, submitted to the governor by the council of the city of Rochester; four persons from a list of not less than eight persons, all of whom must be residents of the county of Monroe submitted by the legislature of the county of Monroe. Other counties electing to participate shall each submit to the governor a list of not less than two persons for each one hundred thousand or major fraction of the total population, as determined by the last federal decennial or federal county-wide special census. From the counties outside the county of Monroe which shall elect to participate, the governor shall appoint one member for each one hundred thousand or major fraction of the total population, as determined by the last federal decennial or federal county-wide special census, with a minimum of one member to represent each county outside the county of Monroe so electing to participate. All members of the authority shall be residents of the area from which they are nominated.

(b) There shall also be one non-voting member of the authority, which shall not be considered in determining a quorum. The non-voting member shall be recommended to the governor by the labor organization representing the plurality of the employees within the authority and shall be a resident of the Rochester-Genesee regional transportation district as described in section twelve hundred ninety-nine-cc of this title. The non-voting member shall be appointed for a term of five years, provided, however, that if at any time during the term of appointment the non-vot-
