### COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, New York State Public Health Law, Article 6, requires that in order for a county to receive State Aid it must charge for services at a rate comparable to the cost of providing these services, and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Health Department currently charges fees for Environmental Health services under a fee schedule which was amended in the 2006 budget, and

WHEREAS, the enhanced revenues will be directly applied to assist in offsetting the cost of the Restaurant Permit program, and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that this action will result in an annual revenue increase of approximately \$265,500 over and above \$796,113 generated by the current fees. This represents a 33% increase, and

WHEREAS, this increase brings the revenue closer to the cost of providing the services as required by New York State Public Health Law, Article 6, and

WHEREAS, the proposed fees compare favorably with fees charged in the larger counties of New York as follows:

### COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Mental Health is responsible for the delivery of a comprehensive range of mental health and chemical dependency services for the residents of Erie County, and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Mental Health has been awarded \$108,424 by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services as part of a State award to Jewish Family Services, Inc., and

WHEREAS, no County funds will be required for Erie County to accept these New York State funds to serve individuals or families affected by gambling disorders, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Services has identified Jewish Family Services, Inc., as the recipient of this award through a statewide Request for Proposals process, and

WHEREAS, the Eric County Legislature has already authorized the County and the Department of Mental Health to contract with Jewish Family Services, Inc., in 2006.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the 2006 appropriation, contract and funds reservation for Jewish Family Services, Inc. (GL 516010), be increased by \$108,424 in the Operating Fund accounts of the Erie County Department of Mental Health to provide gambling addiction treatment services for the period January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006. The source of these funds being NYS Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services State Aid dollars (GL 406860), and be it further

#### COUNTY EXECUTIVE

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has awarded funding to upgrade state and local public health preparedness and response capabilities relative to bioterrorism, and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Health has received a continuation grant award in the amount of \$ 950,265 from New York State Health Research, Inc. (HRI) to plan and develop response capacity to a bioterrorism event in collaboration with New York State, and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Health has received a grant award in the amount of \$150,000 from New York State Health Research, Inc. (HRI) to develop a plan under the Cities Readiness Initiative (CRI) for Erie County, and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Health has received funding through the Western New York Public Health Alliance in the amount of \$75,488 to provide services relative to establishing a Rural Advanced Practice Center for Excellence in Public Health Preparedness, and

WHEREAS, the eight (8) Counties of Western New York comprised of Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Niagara, Orleans and Wyoming have joined together as the Western New York Public Health Alliance for the purpose of protecting the public health through regional planning and cooperation, and

WHEREAS, the eight (8) Counties of the Western New York Public Health Alliance have designated Erie County as the lead county for the purpose of coordination of the Bioterrorism Plan and are desirous of contracting to provide certain deliverables which are required by Health Research Inc. contract, and will pay Erie County a portion of their State grant for these services, and

WHEREAS, in order to efficiently meet the requirements of this award, it is necessary to implement staffing adjustments which include the creation of one full time position of Administrative Clerk, JG 7, Step 0, B100 number 2406, one full time position of Data Processing Control Clerk, JG 5, Step 0, B100 number 2405, and one part time position of Public Health Preparedness Medical Director, JG 18, Step 5, B100 number 2423, and the deletion of one full-time position of Principal Clerk, JG 6, position number 7403, and one regular part time Regional Medical Director, JG 18, position number 7828, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to reallocate the Regional Coordinator position number 7827, from JG 11 to JG 13, as indicated on B100 control number 2422, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to recruit in Job Group 18, Step 5, for the position of Public Health Preparedness Medical Director (PT) in order to secure and retain a qualified and experienced candidate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Health has received a grant from the New York State Health Department in the amount of \$220,542.00 for the period 10/1/06 through 9/30/07, with an option for two one-year extensions, and

WHEREAS, the County desires to subcontract with various Police agencies, other security agencies in Erie County and the Wellness Institute of Greater Buffalo and Western New York, Inc. to conduct checks of facilities to ascertain compliance with the Clean Indoor Air Act and to conduct checks of merchants who sell tobacco products by using underage operatives who will attempt to purchase tobacco products, and

WHEREAS, the County desires to contract for the services of a software/database developer to develop and maintain a program that will be able to integrate information collected from existing tablet computers into a new data base and to further integrate the developed system with existing State Health Department requirements and conduct the associated training.
