WHEREAS, New York State private insurance companies currently limit the number of inpatient and outpatient mental health visits per year and charge higher deductibles, co-payments and co-insurance costs for mental health and chemical dependency services than for physical health services, and

WHEREAS, A recent study conducted by Price Waterhouse Coopers estimates that the passage of parity legislation also known as Timothy's Law would only increase premiums by \$1.26 per employee per month, and

WHEREAS, thirty three other states have already enacted legislation to end the discriminatory practice of providing differing levels of benefits or coverage based upon whether a patient's illness or condition is mental or physical, and

WHEREAS, New York State Assembly Bill A.830l previously approved and New York State Senate Bill S.5329 would ensure that mental health and chemical dependency coverage is provided by private insurance companies in New York State on terms comparable to other health care and medical services.
