WHEREAS, smoking prohibitions in California, Utah, Vermont, Maryland and Maine as well as in hundreds of cities all over the country prove that smoke-free workplace legislation is good for all businesses, including the restaurant business; and

WHEREAS, in the face of overwhelming evidence that secondhand smoke is a killer, it becomes government's obligation to protect the health of workers; and

WHEREAS, the current county clean indoor air act contains a provision that the law be reviewed every two years;
