WHEREAS, a Project for the Replacement of the CR 341, Cemetery Road, Bridge over Erie Road and Conrail, in the Town of Lancaster, Erie County, PIN 5755.27 (the "Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal Funds and 20% Non-Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the County of Erie desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the Non-Federal share of the costs of the Preliminary Engineering (Scoping & Design V & VI), Right of Way Incidentals and Right-of-Way Acquisition Phases of the Project, PIN 5755.27; and

WHEREAS, that the Project agreement has increased from \$732,000.00 to \$1,761,000.00, of which a sum of \$146,400.00 non-federal share was previously authorized via County Resolutions Nos. 6D-19 of April 29, 1999 and 13E-36 of July 26, 2007, 1999 Federal Aid Bridges and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phases of the Project.

WHEREAS, it is in the economic interest of each and every resident in the County of Erie to have public works projects completed by contractors committed to producing a high quality product at a competitive cost; and

WHEREAS, in Erie County, public works projects are often awarded to contractors who submit the lowest bid, which often ends up costing taxpayers more money over the life of the project; and

WHEREAS, over reliance on the lowest bid without further analysis often masks the overall higher cost of the project based on schedule delays, change orders and poor quality work; and

WHEREAS, effective analysis of a bid for contract should include identifying qualified contractors to increase the likelihood that the project will be performed with high quality work, to specifications and on time; and

WHEREAS, in 2006 Erie County awarded a public works contract for asbestos abatement to the lowest bidder without analyzing the contractor's qualifications, and as a result, the lowest bidder turned out to be an unqualified bidder; and

WHEREAS, the lowest, however unqualified, bidder for the asbestos abatement project utilized undocumented aliens with falsified asbestos abatement licenses and ended up contaminating the job site and surrounding areas with asbestos; and

WHEREAS, the contractor's previous track record included a history of hiring undocumented aliens, civil judgments and various health and safety violations; and

WHEREAS, Erie County did not discover this information because it did not make an attempt to discover if the contractor was a qualified or responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, New York General Municipal Law gives local governments the authority to award contracts to lowest responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, the enactment of a lowest responsible bidder law in Erie County would strengthen contractor screening capabilities and identify qualified bidders; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to produce high quality public works projects in an efficient manner and to decrease unnecessary cost overruns, Erie County should develop an effective screening process to determine the qualifications of contractors bidding on public works projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature supports high quality public works projects and endeavors to create a screening process to determine the qualified bidders for all county public works projects; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature should carefully consider adopting a Local Law which defines a qualified and responsible bidder; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature should discuss and ultimately approve the attached Local Law, or an amended version, to Strengthen and Encourage Lowest Responsible Bidder Requirements for Erie County.

IANNELLO, WHYTE & REYNOLDS

WHEREAS, governments, businesses and private citizens are all concerned about the rising cost of energy and the increase in demand for energy; and

WHEREAS, along with this increase in demand, the environment and the health of the world's population is directly affected by the rise in carbon dioxide emissions related to the world's energy use; and

WHEREAS, one of the fastest growing energy consumption uses by government, business and private individuals is the use of the personal computer (pc); and

WHEREAS, Erie County employees use or have access to approximately 4000 personal computers, according to Erie County's 2008 adopted budget; and

WHEREAS, currently, no requirement exists for employees to turn their personal computers off at the end of the work day or on weekends; and

WHEREAS, most of us are under the impression that screen savers are energy savers which according to the US Department of Energy is a costly misconception; and

WHEREAS, turning off monitors if they are not being used is more beneficial as opposed to the use of the more costly screen savers; and

WHEREAS, turning off one personal computer at night can save Erie County approximately \$75 to \$100 per year; and

WHEREAS, the County of Erie could realize additional savings by making use of such energy saving features that allow the computer to 'hibernate or sleep' when not in use for a specified period of time; and

WHEREAS, if this savings is multiplied by 4000 computers in use by Erie County Government, the County could realize a potential savings of \$300,000 to \$400,000 at today's energy costs; and

WHEREAS, it takes between 60 and 300 trees to absorb the yearly carbon dioxide emissions produced by one computer left on 24 hours a day; and

WHEREAS, the environment and human health factors would also realize the benefits of turning off the personal computers; and

WHEREAS, the US Department of Energy recommends instituting such energy and cost saving measures immediately, creating a win-win for taxpayers and the environment; and

WHEREAS, the US Department of Energy predicts that by the year 2010, just 18 months from now, 20% of each American's electricity bill will come from appliances on standby, the largest portion from personal computers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature institute by formal resolution the following three measures:

- All Erie County employees turn off computers at the end of the work day and on weekends
- All Erie County employees turn off their pc monitor if not using it for more than 20 minutes,
 i.e. lunch or a meeting
- All Erie County employees to discontinue the use of screen savers for a length of time as they are not energy saving devices; and be it further

RESOLVED, that these measures can be implemented with not only the use of government or business computers but, use of private personal computers in homes, resulting in personal savings on energy bills with an additional benefit to our environment; and be it further

RESOLVED, that these measures take effect in 30 days of this legislation as a requirement for all Erie County employees using County owned personal computers in their job performance; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution be considered a further action to make Erie County a "Green County," and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to the County Executive, all County Legislators and their staff, all department heads of Erie County, all employees of Erie County, President of Erie Community College and the director of ECMCC. (5-0)

4. INTRO 17-3 (2008)

IANNELLO, REYNOLDS & WHYTE

WHEREAS, national health organizations, environmental agencies, and physical fitness activists believe increased bicycling and walking to be of national interest not only for health purposes, but also as a mode of transportation; and

WHEREAS, the development of transportation, environmental and public health policies promoting bicycling and walking as a means of transportation should be the concern of local, county, and state governments; and

WHEREAS, persons with disabilities, pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists and transit riders should be able to safely move along and across a 'complete street;' and

WHEREAS, complete streets are defined as facilities that are designed and operated to enable safe access for all users comprehensive across the life span for both recreational and transportation; and

WHEREAS, a complete street is one that has improved safety conditions that encourages users to reduce the number of motor vehicle miles traveled whenever possible through increased use of bicycling or walking trips; and

WHEREAS, the County of Erie is in concert with this philosophy for the safety, health and environmental integrity of all residents, visitors and the community as a whole; and

WHEREAS, school aged youth ages 5 to 17 years old (2006), represents an astonishing 29.4% of the total percentage of bicyclists and 19.8% of pedestrians both injured and killed in New York State; and

WHEREAS, New York State should designate its percentage of safety dollars to be commensurate with the percentage of traffic related deaths that are pedestrians and bicyclists; and

WHEREAS, increased bicycling and walking trips will not only help to reduce the carbon footprint in America, but its intention is also to provide exercise to our children and adults as recent surveys have stated that as many as 65% of the US population is overweight; and

WHEREAS, bicycle commuters save annually on average \$1,825 in auto related costs, carbon emissions by 128 pounds, conserve 145 gallons of gasoline and avoid 50 hours of gridlock traffic; and

WHEREAS, we are a nation of over 300 million people with an expected number of 365 million people by 2030, and 465 million by 2050; and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of that growth is occurring in urban areas where there are significant limitations on accommodating the ever increasing motor vehicle travel; and

WHEREAS, over 200 cities in the United States, representing 35 million people, have committed to action plans to increase bicycling and walking as a mode of transportation utilizing health and quality of life as a performance measure; and

WHEREAS, a national network of interconnected urban and rural bikeways can provide valuable community benefits, including low cost recreation and alternative transportation options for people of all ages; and

WHEREAS, such networking designs must include safe and expanded areas for bicycles and pedestrians and moreover this must begin on the local level of government policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that Erie County join in concert with the 200 US cities to implement a bicycle and pedestrian friendly action plan to achieve the intended goals of good health, improved safety, lessen the carbon imprint while increasing bicycling and walking as a standard mode of transportation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Commissioner of Public Works shall include pedestrian and bicycle facilities in all new street construction, street reconstruction and park projects undertaken by the County of Erie, where fiscally feasible; and be it further

RESOLVED, that if the cost is prohibited due to disproportionate use, meaning that if the cost of the bicycle or pedestrian way exceeds more than 20% of the project, that such bikeways and pathways be omitted from such projects; and be it further

RESOLVED, that if an existing right of way does not grant access for sidewalks, bike lanes or other improvements, that alternative routes be explored and provided whenever possible; and be it further

RESOLVED, that all bicycle and pedestrian walkways be planned, designed, developed and maintained in accordance with the United States Department of Transportation, the New York State Department of Transportation and other guidelines adhered to by Erie County; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the entire focus be on improving human health, decreasing carbon emissions, enhancing safety and increasing walking and bicycle trips as a mode of transportation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that these actions will enable Erie County to become a "Clean Streets County" with "Complete Streets" policies and a leader in New York State; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this only take place if bicyclists and pedestrians are not prohibited by law from using the facility; and be it further

RESOLVED, that we call upon or Federal and State legislators to provide incentives for local governments to adopt and implement "Complete Street" policies designed to accommodate all users; and be it further

Regarding the Provision of Child Protective Services After-Hours

(INTRO 23-2)

A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATORS MAZUR, MARINELLI, WHYTE, MILLS, KOZUB, MILLER-WILLIAMS, KONST, GRANT, WROBLEWSKI, IANNELLO, REYNOLDS & RATH

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 3153-A, which removes certain special powers granted to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (SPCC), was approved by both houses of the New York State Legislature in June 2008 and was delivered to the Governor on November 14, 2008; and

WHEREAS, provisions of this bill are in direct conflict with the authority of state and local Child Protective Services (CPS); and

WHEREAS, the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (NYS OCFS) has voiced its opposition to this legislation; and

WHEREAS, should the Governor sign this bill into law, it would have an immediate, harsh, unintended and negative fiscal and service impact on both Erie County and New York State; and

WHEREAS, when first proposed, the bill contained language that would allow local Social Services Departments (DSS) to contract with SPCC designated agencies for the provision of after-hours CPS coverage and for the removal of children from unsafe situations; and

WHEREAS, amendments made to the bill just before its passage in June removed this authority; and

WHEREAS, should the bill become law, those changes would force the Erie County Department of Social Services (ECDSS) to provide after-hours coverage with direct care staff at an additional cost of well over \$1.2 million, of which the state would be obligated to pay approximately 63.7% (reduced from the previous 65% state share) or \$764,400; and

WHEREAS, this local and state fiscal impact would increase after including administrative and non-personal service expenditures; and

WHEREAS, currently, the Erie County after-hours coverage plan under the SPCC contract with Child and Family Services (CFS) has an overall cost of \$320,000 with a state share of \$203,840; and

WHEREAS, unlike the experience of certain downstate DSS districts with "rogue" agencies having an SPCC designation, ECDSS has been able to provide after-hours coverage effectively through a contract with Child and Family Services for over three (3) decades and has the full support of NYS OCFS to operate this way; and

WHEREAS, Child and Family Services is a premier not-for-profit provider with a trained and skilled workforce adept at addressing the state mandated requirements for treatment of children and families; and, CFS has never engaged in the kind of activities that were the subject of both the Attorney General and State Comptroller investigations downstate, which may have prompted the original drafting of this bill; and

WHEREAS, the contractual relationship between the Erie County Department of Social Services and Child and Family Services has been overwhelmingly positive, and for more than thirty (30) years, there has never been any negative impact on services or child protection, given the fact that the CFS staff is fully trained and supervised by the local social service district; and

WHEREAS, in order for this proposed legislation to be implemented, the costly and ill-conceived change in the historical practice for the provision of after-hours CPS coverage in Erie County would require significant lead time for both the development and implementation of a viable plan, including the recruitment and training of additional personnel, yet the effective date of the legislation is immediate upon its signing by the Governor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature go on record in opposition of yet another onerous, unfunded mandate on Erie County; and be it further

WHEREAS, on behalf of the constituents we are elected to serve, a top priority for Erie County going into 2009 should be to combat poverty and to assess the government's response to this growing problem in Buffalo; and

WHEREAS, this assessment will include a review of efforts currently under way by both government and not-for-profit agencies, as well as the community investment priorities of the philanthropic community, to employ best practices for combating poverty.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature call upon federal, state, municipal and school officials to report on actions that will coalesce the efforts of all stakeholders into an effective, community-wide response to the poverty crisis; and be it further

Voicing Support for United States Senate Bill 2589, the Ed Walker Memorial Act for Improvements to the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program (INTRO 23-4)

A RESOLUTION TO BE SUBMITTED BY LEGISLATORS MAZUR, MARINELLI, WHYTE, MILLS, KOZUB, KENNEDY, MILLER-WILLIAMS, KONST, GRANT, WROBLEWSKI, IANNELLO & REYNOLDS

RE:

WHEREAS, Ed Walker founded the Bethlehem Steel Action Group, the driving force behind the effort to obtain justice and compensation for former Bethlehem Steel workers who experienced radiation-related health complications after working at the Lackawanna steel plant during the Cold War as part of America's nuclear program; and

WHEREAS, during World War II and at the start of the Cold War, the federal government lacked the capacity to manufacture nuclear weapons in federal facilities and turned to the private sector for help; and

WHEREAS, workers at these facilities handled high levels of radioactive materials and were responsible for helping to create the American nuclear arsenal that served as a deterrent to the Soviet Union during the Cold War; and

WHEREAS, although government scientists knew of the dangers posed by the radiation, workers were given little or no protection, and many have been diagnosed with and have succumbed to cancer; and

WHEREAS, Ed Walker worked at Bethlehem Steel from 1951 to 1954; and, after graduating high school, became an apprentice bricklayer and member of the "hot team," a group of workers who patched holes in the company's furnaces; and

WHEREAS, after serving in the U.S. Army for two years, he formed his own subcontracting company, but health issues forced him to retire in 1993; and

WHEREAS, diagnosed with bladder cancer, Ed Walker filed a claim with the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program, as be believed his bladder cancer was related to his work rolling uranium for the government in the early 1950's at Bethlehem Steel; and

WHEREAS, the claim he filed was denied, and Ed Walker founded the Bethlehem Steel Action Group and was joined by a group of former workers who fought for better administration of the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program; and

WHEREAS, Ed Walker passed on earlier this year, and U.S. Senator Charles E. Schumer, who has carried legislation to make improvements to the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program, re-introduced the measure in February 2008 and named the bill in Ed Walker's memory; and

WHEREAS, if the Schumer bill is approved and signed into law, the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program, which was created by an act of Congress in the year 2000, will be reformed to benefit nuclear workers at Bethlehem Steel and other former New York atomic weapons production facilities; and

WHEREAS, if passed by Congress and signed into law by the President, the Ed Walker Memorial Act will correct years of injustice for Western New York's nuclear workers and Cold War heroes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature convey its support for S. 2589, sponsored by U.S. Senator Charles E. Schumer, which would amend the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act of 2000 to include certain former nuclear weapons program workers in the Special Exposure Cohort; and be it further
