



**Recycling Program:** Village Treasurer Dan Borchert reported to the Boards that on April 1<sup>st</sup> a new E-Waste law goes into effect regarding disposal of electronics. He has been working with 2 of the Counties vendors on a program to offer residents. The compost site will be moving to the Lewis Rd wastewater treatment plant for the summer and he is looking into placing temporary drop-off bins for electronics at that site that would be open to residents on Saturdays when the compost site is open. The bins must be kept inside out of the weather elements so this is an ideal situation for this year until the joint facility is finished. He also reported his investigations into a hazardous waste drop-off seem to be cost prohibitive. The average cost would be \$25-\$30 per vehicle that uses the drop-off, whether they had 1 can of paint or 12 cans. The Boards decided they would contact Legislator Ray Walter to see about having a County drop-off scheduled somewhere closer to Akron, maybe in Clarence.

**Water District Project:** The town will be starting a waterline project this summer and would like to look at the possibility of the town and village crews doing some of the digging work to save money. The 2 Superintendents will coordinate their work schedules to see what can be accomplished.

**Sidewalk Project- Buell to Clarence Center:** the town would like to install a Sidewalk from Buell Street to the town hall sidewalk. This is approximately a 300' section and would cost approximately \$2500 in materials. They will work together and with neighboring parcels to see if this can happen this summer.

**Joint Comprehensive Master Plan:** waiting for word on whether a grant will be forthcoming to cover the costs. If not, both Boards agreed to set aside budget money for next year to move forward on this item. It has been 7 – 8 years since the last plan was done.

**Joint Purchasing of Vehicles/Equipment:** Councilman Rooney questioned if the municipalities purchased together what could be saved. Both Superintendents stated most vehicles are purchased on State bid and you can't do any better than that on pricing but they may be able to do this on some future equipment purchases.

**Child ID Program:** Councilman Rooney questioned if there is a program we could offer locally instead of thru the Sheriffs. The boards decided that Councilman Rooney and Trustee Capan will look into the possibilities and report back to both boards.

**Community Business Survey/Inventory:** Councilman Rooney explained he would like to do a survey that would show what types of businesses are currently operating in the town and village and where they are located. The purpose being to look at ways of retaining the businesses we currently have as well as addressing what types of new businesses are needed in the area and what we need to do to bring them into town and then retain them. Councilman Rooney and Trustee Forrestel were appointed to contact the Chamber of Commerce and attend their next meeting to get their members input into this project. Attorney Neill stated there is a new state program that offers tax incentives to small businesses to open and/or expand in the region that we could look into.

**Annexations:** Updates are Niagara Specialty has withdrawn their application to the Village, the Cowan property is still on hold and Niagara Label has hired counsel to explore the possibility of expansion and annexation.

**CEO Contract-** The Boards entered executive session together to discuss the CEO contract at 10:10pm. The Boards exited executive session at 10:30pm having taken no action.

The Supervisor thanked everyone for coming. The meeting was adjourned at 10:35pm by Councilman Rooney, seconded by Councilman Baran.
