

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's), About 2019 Elder Law Day

What is Elder Law Day?

Elder Law Day is a free event providing unbiased, up-to-date legal information regarding long term care. There are seminars to attend led by local elder law attorneys, community agencies available to share their information and expertise about community services. In addition, there are attorneys conducting one-on-one, free 15-minute legal consultations. You must sign up for these ahead of time by registering for Elder Law Day.

Who can attend Elder Law Day?

Elder Law Day is free and open to the public. Those who may be most interested are older adults, their families, caregivers, students, and professionals in aging services.

When and where is it being held?

Elder Law Day will be held on Thursday, June 6th at the Millennium Hotel, 2040 Walden Ave, (next to the Galleria Mall) in Cheektowaga NY 14228. Time is from 8:00-1:30.

Is there a cost to attend?

Free and open to the public; however, we do provide an opportunity for guests to make a donation at the door. It is entirely voluntary.

How do I register?

While all are welcome, we encourage people to register ahead of time at erie.gov/ELD because we need to provide a final count to the hotel. Those who are registered will receive lunch, raffle tickets for a basket raffle, and a reusable canvas bag with program materials inside.

How will I know I'm registered?

We will send out a confirmation post card in the mail.

Do I have to bring anything with me on the day of the event?

Your post card is your best confirmation of registration. Please bring it with you.

Will food be provided during the event?

There is coffee, tea, and water available during the event. For those who register ahead of time, a light lunch will be reserved.
